in manner following to wit 1<sup>st</sup> after paying all  
my just debts and funeral expences I leave unto my  
well beloved wife Jane McKee one third part of  
the plantation whereon I now live and one third part  
of my personal Estate excepting what may hereafter  
be otherwise willed or bequeathed during her natural  
life also I leave unto my said wife my negro woman  
named Ann with her I spend during her life  
2<sup>nd</sup> I give unto my sons John and Samuel McKee  
my tract of land of four hundred acres on Madalysen  
in the county of Lycen brier and state of Virginia  
to them and their heirs forever to be equally divided  
between them precisely to quantity and quality  
3<sup>rd</sup> I give unto William McKee (my wife's son)  
the sum of ten Dollars and that is all the  
said William is to have of my estate. 4<sup>th</sup> I give  
unto my Daughter Peggy McKee one hundred  
acres of land on the waters of Benson it being a  
part of the balance of an eight hundred acre  
survey which I have at that place also one negro  
girl named Kizga and her increase one feather  
bed and furniture and a mare and saddle called  
her mate now to her and her heirs forever  
5<sup>th</sup> I give unto my Daughter Mary McKee one  
hundred acres of land on the waters of Benson it  
being a part of the balance of an eight hundred acre  
survey which I have at that place also one negro  
girl named Phebe and her increase and feather bed  
and furniture and one mare and saddle to

theirs forever 6<sup>th</sup> I give unto my two sons James  
McKee and Robert McKee (after taking out my  
wifes third part of the tract of land I now live  
on) all the balance of said tract together with  
fully three acres of land adjoining Adams Harpers that  
he purchased from Kyle to be equally divided between  
them with their Mothers third part of said tract  
at her death agreeable to quantity and quality to  
them and their heirs forever 7<sup>th</sup> It is my will  
and desire that the balance of my negroes to wit  
Ben Sambo Henry Lins and Blary be hired out  
until my youngest son become of age and the mon-  
ey arising therefrom to go to the support and  
maintaining my wife and four youngest children  
hereafter named Peggy Mary W James & Robert  
McKees then it is my will and desire that the  
above named negroes to wit Ben Sambo Henry  
Lins and Blary be equally divided between my four  
sons John McKee Samuel McKee James McKee  
and Robert McKee to them and their heirs forever  
8<sup>th</sup> It is further my will and desire that all my  
out standing debts be collected by my Ex<sup>ors</sup> to geth-  
er with what cash I may have after deducting what  
may be necessary to compensate them for their  
trouble in collecting and for other services they  
may render the balance then to be put by them  
to interest and the interest to be equally divided  
yearly among my children (to wit) John Samuel  
Peggy Mary W James and Robert McKees. 9<sup>th</sup>  
It is my will and desire that the negro woman  
Ann and her increase together with the personal  
property I lent to my wife shall be at her  
equally divided among my children John  
Peggy Mary W James and Robert McKees to

and their heirs forever 10<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire  
that all the balance of my estate both real and  
personal be sold and equally divided among my  
six children to wit John McKee Samuel McKee  
Peggy McKee Mary McKee James McKee and  
Robert McKee to them and their heirs forever  
And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my  
friends George Holloway my wife Jane my son  
John Samuel Brooking and my nephew John McKee  
my Executors and Executors to this my last will  
and testament hereby revoking all other or former wills  
or ~~will~~ Testaments by me heretofore made I  
subscribe whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal  
this 14<sup>th</sup> day of July 1812

This last will and testament of Robert McKee  
deceased was produced in court and proven by George  
Holloway a witness thereto and continued for further  
proof. And November County Court 1812 was  
fully proven by the oath of George Blackburn  
and ordered to be recorded whereupon Jane  
McKee widow and next of said Robert deceased came  
into court and renounced the provisions made her in  
her husbands will. whereupon on motion Samuel  
Brooking one of the executors named in said will  
came into court and administration of said Estate with  
the will annexed is granted him who thereupon  
took the oath prescribed by law and accepted bond  
with Benjamin Berry John Francisco and Joseph Hunkard  
his securities in the penalty of \$7,000 conditioned ac-  
cording to law Teste John McKinney J. C.

Be this my first and only will and testament  
 I leave unto my wife Semine Redd the tract of  
 land I live on during her life at her death I  
 give and bequeath the said tract of land to my  
 son John Redd. It is also my wish and desire  
 that my wife Semine Redd should raise and edu-  
 cate my two children up a genteel manner with  
 the money arising from the hire of my negroes or the  
 keeping them at home which she may deem the  
 most profitable it is also my wish desire when my  
 Daughter Patsy Redd becomes of age or married or  
 when my son John becomes of age my wife Semine  
 Redd should cause there to be three equal divi-  
 ions of my negroes which the one is marrying or  
 becomes of age may draw for her or his part also  
 in the like manner when the second should become  
 of age it is also my wish after the first part  
 is so drawn for the other two parts should be put  
 in one common stock till the second comes of age  
 and then in like manner divide the said negroes  
 again in two parts the one of which my wife Se-  
 mine Redd has during her life at her death  
 to be equally divided between the said two chil-  
 dren Patsy and John Redd. I give and bequeath  
 unto my wife Semine Redd forever all my stock of  
 horses cattle sheep and hogs also all my household  
 and kitchen furniture also all my farming utensils of  
 every description also I give unto my wife Semine Redd  
 a certain portion of property that falls to me at my  
 mother's death out of which property or money and the  
 personal property which I wish my wife Semine Redd  
 to make Patsy Redd nearly or to equal John Redd  
 in wealth as she conveniently can. Now be it

the family understood that if my two children Patsy Redd  
 and John Redd should die before they become of age  
 or not leaving a lawful heir or heirs of her or his body  
 that the whole of the foregoing named property toll  
 land and negroes shall be entirely inherited by my  
 wife Semine Redd without any kind of reserve  
 whatsoever this first day of November 1872

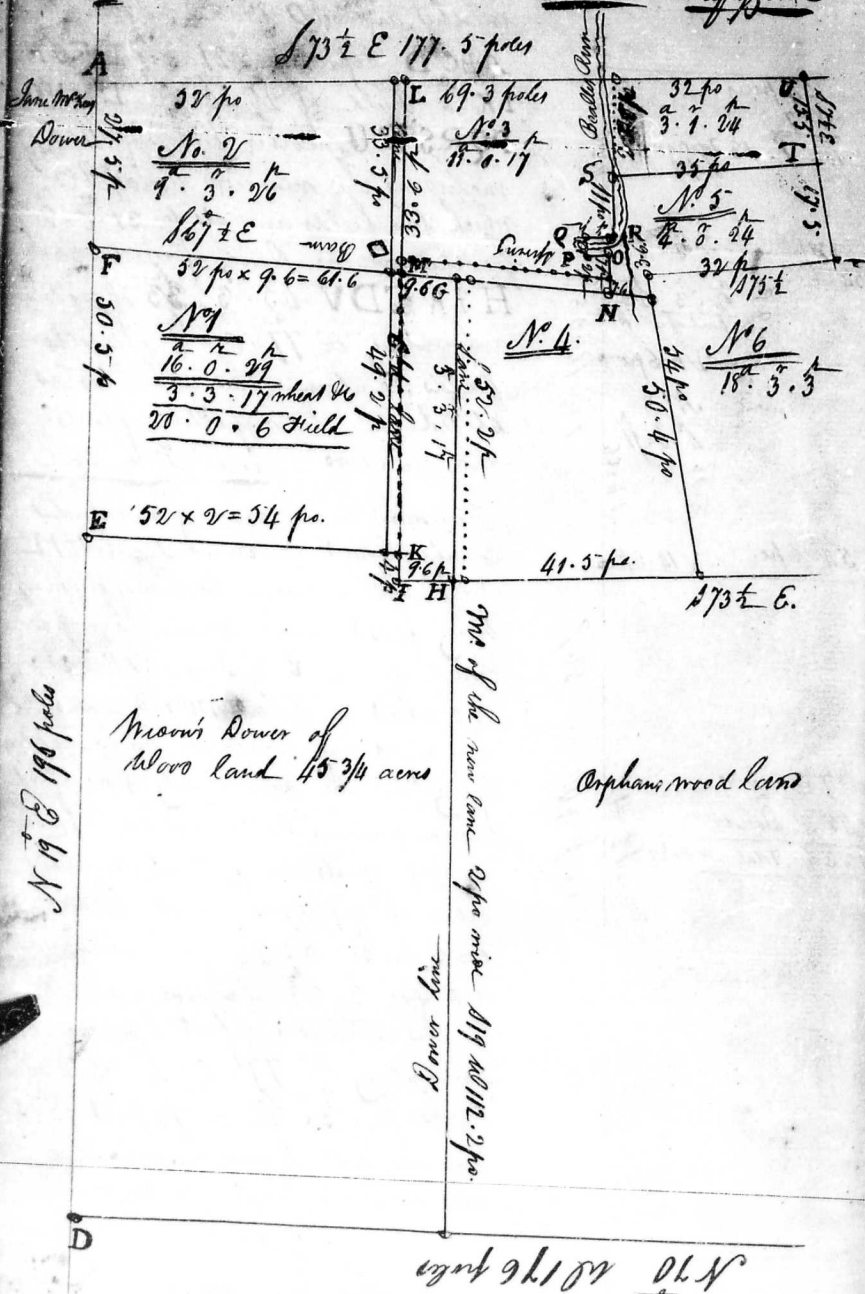

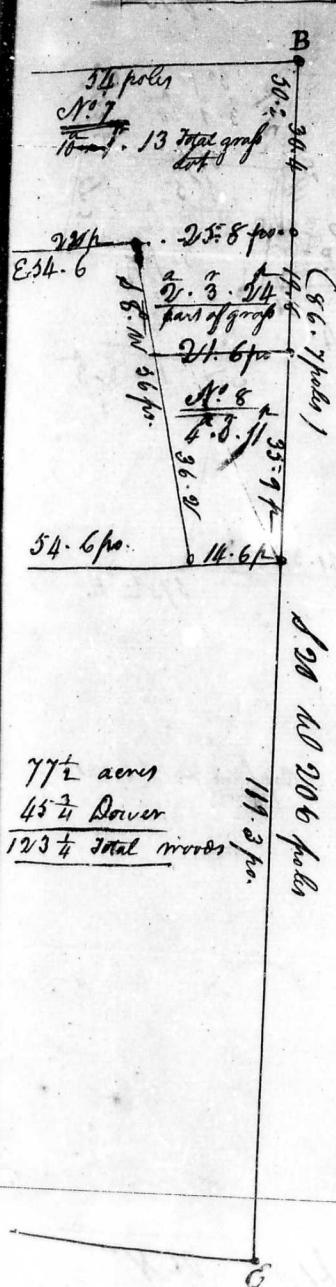
