 follows vizt Infirmity after my decease I give unto my
 beloved wife Elizabeth all my estate both real & personal
 (except the plantation where son Charles now lives)

 William a forty dollar horse a saddle & bridle with ten
 dollars cash to him and his heirs forever. Item after my
 decease it is my will that the land and plantation whereon son
 Charles now lives should be sold to the highest bidder on
 a credit of one or two years as my Executors shall think best
 and the purchase money be put to interest for the benefit of my
 children. Item After my wife's decease I give to son Edmund one
 hundred dollars to be made out of my estate to him & his heirs
 forever Item the balance of my estate not yet bequeathed I give
 to be equally divided between my children namely Charles
 Eliza Mary William Fanny Martha Susanna Sarah and
 Edmund to them and their lawful heirs forever It is also
 my will that my rifle gun be son Williams. Lastly I constitute
 & appoint son Charles and Archibald Wilson to be Executors of
 this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 26th day of
 August 1811
