Wallace until he arrives to the age of twenty
one years. I hereby request and empower my
executors herein after named or a majority of
those of them who shall qualify and in. contri-
ne alive to dispose of at private sale about
four hundred and sixty six acres of land lying
on the waters of Lost creek and trace water
