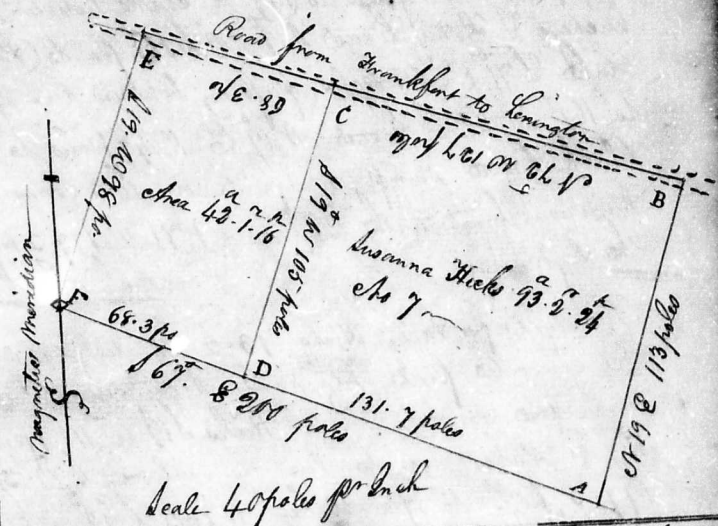

Woodford County Let me the undersigned commissioners in obedience to an order of the county court for said county made at their October Court 1813 directing us to attend to Sarah Brittenson widow and relict of John Brittenson deceased her dower in his personal estate and to divide the residue among his heirs & representatives. report as follows, that we met at the house of Mrs Brittenson on the 17th of November 1813 for the purpose aforesaid but in consequence of an agreement between the widow & heirs of said decedent (whereby she agrees to receive and they to give a certain sum of money annually during her life in lieu of her dower in the personal estate) we did not allot her dower and proceeded to divide seventeen slaves belonging to the estate of said deceased among his heirs. 1st we valued the said seventeen slaves to the sum of \$4535 as will appear hereafter as they are distributed by name & their separate valuation annexed and divided them in the manner following 2nd we allotted to John W Smith (who intermarried with Harriet Brittenson one of the daughters of said dec^d) George a negro man valued at \$250 Beverly a negro boy valued at \$275 and Bently a negro boy valued at \$225 amounting to \$750 which exceeds the sum of \$617 each child's proportion \$103. 3rd we allotted to John & Brittenson Frederick a negro boy valued at \$350 & Jimmy a negro woman & her child Morris valued at \$275 amounting to \$625 which exceeds his proportion \$8. 4th we allotted to Thomas & Brittenson Isaac a negro man valued at \$500 & Washington a negro boy valued at \$150 which exceeds his proportion \$33. 5th we allotted to John McManney Esq (who intermarried with Margaret Brittenson one of the heirs of said dec^d & to whom Henry Brittenson another of the heirs has transferred his interest in said estate) Bob a negro man at \$220 Ambrose a negro man valued at \$10 & Adam a negro
