We Richard Fox and William Christopher two of the commissioners for the division of lands appointed by the worshipful county court of Woodford at their Term By virtue of an act of assembly approved March 1st 1797 being called by William Endicott assignee or transferee of William Mose to divide a certain tract of 124 1/4 acres of land between him the said William and John Mose according to a clause in the last will and testament of John Mose dec^d that on the 26th day of August 1813 in the presence of the parties at the house of said William Endicott agreeable to notice conferred and given we proceeded to make such division and having examined upon oath Geo. Mosely Nicholas Mosely and William Mose it was clearly proven that the intention and declaration of the said Testator was that the branch running between the plantations or dividing the houses of his two sons to wit Wm & John Mose was and should be the division line between them therefore we are of opinion that the said branch shall be the division line accordingly the said William Endicott's part is
