Senator, S. R. Christie of Terrell County. M. July 24, 1889, Died and buried Decatur, Georgia. Eddie Alton Breedlove, b. December 4, 1871, Terrell County, M. Maggie Sessions, Terrell County, d. December 27, 1947, Resided Graves Station, Georgia, buried in Cedar Hill Cemetery. Lucius Breedlove, b. April 6, 1876, in Terrell County, Never married. D. March 14, 1953. Buried in Cedar Hill Cemetery. Alfred Wesley Breedlove had a first cousin, named Benjamin Franklin Breedlove. B. F. Breedlove was a Methodist preacher. He married Anna Morell, of Savannah and lived and preached in Cuthbert, Fort Valley, Montezuma, Marshallville, Griffin, Macon and Talbotton, Georgia. He had three daughters, Annie, Mamie, and Georgia, graduates of Wesleyan College, Macon. He had two sons, George and Echols.

### Aven Family History, 1857-1970

The Aven's were early settlers of North Hampton County, North Carolina, and later migrated to Georgia.

Eudonah Wesley Aven, son of James Stanford Aven and Rebecca Rogers Aven, was born in Webster County, Georgia, May 3, 1857, died August 8, 1931, in Atlanta, buried in Parrott, Terrell County, and his wife Frances Lorena Pritchard, was the daughter of James Henry Pritchard and Jane Swann Pritchard, born March 10, 1863, and died February 9, 1932, in Atlanta, buried in Parrott, Terrell County.

To this union (5) five children were born; Dr. Carl Cato Aven, b. February 9, 1887, Dr. James Loyd Aven, May 30, 1890, Annie Lorena Aven, b. August 27, 1892, Alice Ruby Aven, b. November 25, 1894; Eudonah Wesley Aven, b. February 28, 1898.

Marriages: Dr. Carl Cato Aven, to Nancy Clydia Gordon, June 29, 1910. Nancy Clydia Gordon Aven died Atlanta, buried, Atlanta. Dr. Carl Cato Aven, to Mary Gault Boswell, June 23, 1933. Dr. James Loyd Aven, never married, buried in Parrott, Georgia. Annie Lorena Aven to Walter Louis Smith, September 17, 1914. Alice Ruby Aven to Frederick Roy Crouch, November 10, 1912. Frederick Roy d. March 1957, buried in Dawson. Alice Ruby Aven Crouch to

Collins Golden Christian, April 4, 1968. Collins Golden Christian d. May 26, 1970, buried in Americus, Georgia.

### William Chambless Family

William Chambless was born around 1802 or 1803. His birthplace is unknown at this time. He married Polly Huckaby on December 23, 1823 in Jones County, Georgia. She was born around 1804 or 1805. Her name is listed as "Mary" on some census records. Her place of birth is also unknown at this time. She died September 16, 1881 in Terrell County. Her husband preceded her in death some time prior to July 21, 1862. He died in Terrell County also. They are buried in the Chambless Private Cemetery about one mile west of Graves, Georgia. They first came to Randolph County in the 1830s and settled on land that is now part of Terrell County.

William and Polly Huckaby Chambless had seven sons and one daughter as follows:

Benjamin Franklin Chambless was born about 1824 and died April 20, 1881. He married Lucy Chambers (daughter of Joseph and Lucinda Chambers) in Terrell County. She was born about 1848 and died March 29, 1911. Benjamin Franklin and his wife, Lucy, are buried at Chickasawhatchee Primitive Baptist Church located at the edge of the Dawson city limits. They had eight children as follows: Lillie m. Ernest Edwards, b. 1869, d. 7-4-1911; Joseph (Jodie) m. Leska McLendon, b. 1870, d. 8-1922; Franklin never married, b. 4-23-1872, d. 1960; Charlie m. Florence Adams, b. 1877; Rosa Mae m. Walter Leverett, b. 11-30-1878; unknown; unknown; unknown.

William Chambless was born March 30, 1828 and died November 9, 1906. He married Talitha Chambless in Randolph County, Georgia, on December 24, 1851. She was born May 19, 1830 and died October 11, 1919. William Chambless and his wife, Talitha are buried at the Funston Cemetery on Route 1, Moultrie, Georgia. William Chambless is listed with his brother, B. F. on seven original Muster Rolls as Privates in Company B, 2nd (Storey's) Regiment Infantry, Georgia State Line, C. S. A. William and Talitha Chambless had the following children:

Mary m. John Henry; Talitha Frances; Amanda m. Robert S. Arnett. She was born May 26, 1858, d. Feb. 1, 1935; Samantha, b. May 26, 1858; William Benjamin, b. July 8, 1860, d. July 3, 1915; Martha; John; Anna; Lula, b. May 11, 1870, m. J. Edward Allegood.

George Chambless is listed as being 18 years of age on 1850 in Randolph County, Georgia, Census. He does not appear on 1860 Terrell County Census records. This is the only documentary evidence we have of his birth at this time.

Thomas Chambless was born around 1834. He married Mary F. Kelley, daughter of George W. Kelley and the granddaughter of C. R. Kelley, Sr., in Terrell County on June 17, 1858.

Thomas Chambless was a Private in Company F, 51st Regiment, Georgia Volunteer Infantry, C. S. A. He died February 7, 1863 of pneumonia in Chimborazo Hospital No. 2, Richmond, Virginia.

Thomas and Mary Kelley Chambless had two sons: George W. Chambless m. 1st. Lydia "Babe" Mitchell on December 23, 1879. 2nd. ? Bellflower. Joseph Marion Chambless was born July 10, 1860 and died in March 1933. He married Mary Lou Smith.

James H. (Doc) Chambless was born June 3, 1836 and died March 17, 1910. He married Albener Sybil Slocumb in Terrell County on July 28, 1863. She was the daughter of Jesse Slocumb and Jane Huckaby Slocumb. Her grandfather was John Charles Slocumb and her grandmother was Lydia Reaves Slocumb or Jones County, Georgia. Doc and Albener Sybil Slocumb are buried in Turkey Creek Church Cemetery in Webster County, Georgia. Doc Chambless and his wife had eight children who were born at Chamblesston, Georgia near Parrott.
