3-Gen. Paul (1778-1844), served War of 18 yrs. mem. N.C. Legislature, m Elizabeth Capt. Matthew Locke Brandon, Row soldier Am. Rev.

6-Samuel **Wethered**, m 1680, Dolly, dau William Lewin, who emigrated to 1720, with her children, settled in K Md.;

5-Richard, m Isabella Bay;

4-John, m Mary, dau. Judge James Syke 1st Cont. Congress;

3-Lewin (1822-67), Baltimore, m Elizabeth Elias Ellicott (5th from Andrew Ellicott came to America, 1730).
