William Lowrey Family

William Lowrey and his wife, Nancy S. (McGill) Lowrey, settled in Murray County about 1836 in company with a number of relatives and neighbors from Lincoln County, North Carolina. Those relatives included some of Nancy's brothers and her mother, Rebecca (McCormick) McGill, widow of John McGill, who died in 1819 in Lincoln County.

William Lowrey was born about 1801 in Lincoln County. He was the son of North Carolina Revolutionary soldier Thomas Lowrey. Thomas died in Lincoln County in December of 1835, but his widow, Sarah (Richardson) Lowrey, came to Georgia with her family and was living in Gilmer County in 1850 with a son-in-law and daughter, Issac and Rachel Mullinax. Sarah died in 1852 and is buried at Antioch Baptist Cemetery in what is now Pickens County.

William and Nancy lived near Spring Place. They died sometime after 1870. They were the parents of 10 children, according to census records. They included:

- 1) Thomas Lowrey, born about 1826 in North Carolina, married Harriet Henderson. Children of Thomas and Harriet Lowrey included Edwin L., born about 1857; Nancy L, born about 1858; Martha E., born about 1859; Thomas J., born about 1863; Fanny J., born about 1866; Harriett, born about 1874; and James V., born about 1879. Some members of this family are buried in the Free Hope Cemetery in Murray County.
 - 2) Lucinda Lowrey, born ca. 1829, married Matthew Black.
 - 3) Martha Lowrey, born ca. 1830, married Isaac R. Desha.
 - 4) Martin S. Lowrey, born ca. 1832.
- 5) William M. Lowrey, born November 1838. He married Mary F. Compton in 1860 and became a farmer and Baptist preacher. He lived in Whitfield County. In 1880, the U.S. Census listed in his household these children: Nancy S.F., born about 1862; Medora A., born about 1866; John S., born about 1868; Oscar L., born about 1874; Lilly J., born about 1876; and Anna E. Lowrey, born about 1878. The 1900 census also listed a younger daughter, Minnie M., born May 1884.
- 6) John Wesley Lowrey, born 5 February 1841. He served the Confederacy as a soldier in Wright's Brigade, Army of Northern Virginia, and was wounded

and captured at Gettysburg. Returning home, he married Mary Adaline Henry, daughter of Joel and Elizabeth (Davis) Henry. John W. Lowrey died in 1917 and his wife in 1915. They are buried in Spring Place Cemetery. Their children were:

a) Alice Lee Lowrey, born 29 May 1866. She married William Lawrence Fox in 1886, and in 1902, she and her husband moved to Texas, settling first in Hunt County and later in Lamar County. She died in 1932 and her husband in 1919, and both are buried at Oakwood Cemetery, Honey Grove, Texas.

b) William Mercer Lowrey, born 6 August 1868, died 22 Jan. 1920, buried in Spring Place Cemetery. He was married in 1898 to Lola Clyde Gregory, and

after her death, he married Theodosia (Bagwell) Everett.

c) Ellen Lowrey, born November 1870, married Jessie Ogles in 1892. She and her husband are listed on the 1900 census of Murray County. She is said to have died in Texas and to be buried in Honey Grove.

d) Mary "Mollie" Lowrey, born ca. 1873, married James H. Dunn in 1889.

e) John T. Lowrey, born May 1875. In 1897 he married Susan Flood. In later years, he lived at Monticello, Arkansas.

f) Rosa T. Lowrey, born ca. 1878, married Joe Hannah in 1896.

g) Thomas Lowrey, born 1 June 1880. He died in 1955 in Savannah, GA, and apparently did not marry. He is buried in Spring Place Cemetery.

h) Joseph E. Lowrey, born 4 December 1882, died 1910, buried in Spring Place Cemetery, He was killed in a saw mill boiler explosion in Arkansas.

i) Dora A. Lowrey, born 15 February 1886, died 6 September 1906.

j) Maud Viola Lowrey, born 17 June 1888, died 10 August 1906. She and her sister, Dora, died of typhoid fever. Both are buried in Spring Place Cemetery with other members of their family.

7) Elizabeth Lowrey, born ca. 1845 in Georgia. She married L.H. Adams in 1860. 8) Barthena A.M.A. Lowrey, born ca. 1847. She married William McDaniel in 1861. 9) Julia Ann Lowrey, born ca. 1849. 10) Louisa M. Lowrey, born ca. 1852.

The John Luffman Family

1872. Never married. Was a lawyer; served in Mexican War; served in Civil War where he commanded the 11th Ga. Inf. Regiment and commanded the Ga. Brigade at Gettsyburg after General Anderson was wounded; was a Representative after the Civil War.

(4) Jane Luffman b. 1821, N.C., married John Beamer; see his line.

(5) Sitha Ann Luffman, b. 1825, N.C., d. 1906. Although late in life she married a Gibson, she is buried under maiden name next to the Beamers in Sardis Cem., Murray Co., Ga.
