

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

KNOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by Edward Garrison have Given and Granted, and by these Presents do Give and Grant unto the said Edward Garrison a Tract of Land, containing Anesha one hundred Acres, lying and being in our County of Bladen —

On the East side of Drowning Branch and on the Lower side of Poplar Branch and West side of the great Swamp Beginning near said Swamp at a Large Pond and Running North thirty five degrees West One hundred and Twenty Seven Poles to a Stake and there takes thent North fifty five degrees East One hundred and Twenty Seven Poles to a Stake in the great Swamp. Then South thirty five degrees East one hundred and Twenty Seven Poles to another. Then South fifty five degrees West One hundred and Twenty Seven Poles to the Beginning as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods, Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said Edward Garrison his Heirs and Assigns, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may direct. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said Edward Garrison shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of Bladen within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void and of no Effect.
