come, Greeting.*

**K** NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by *George Jefferson* have Given and Granted, and by these Presents do Give and Grant unto the said *George Jefferson* a Tract of Land, containing

*three hundred* Acres, lying and being in our County of *Anson*.

*North East of Red Beginning at Lower Corner White Oak and pointers then along Lines South Eleven West Ninety five poles to a stake and three pines then North Eighty East one hundred and eighty poles to Jo. H. H. Corner then along H. H. line North ten West two hundred and Sixty six poles to a stake amongst two black Jacks and two pines the Corner of his New Survey then along his own line South Eighty West two hundred and Seventy poles to a stake amongst pointers then along his own line of an other Survey South*

*Beginning* *Twenty Eight East one hundred and Ninety poles to the* as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods, Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said *George Jefferson* his Heirs and Assigns, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may direct. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said *George Jefferson* shall cause this Grant to

be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of *Anson* within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void and of no Effect.
