come, Greeting.

K NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of
Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid
into our Treasury by *John Brown*
have Given and Granted, and by these
Presents do Give and Grant unto the said *John Brown*
a Tract of Land, containing

Three hundred Acres, lying and being in our County of

Bladen

On the East side of Drowning Creek and on both sides of
Ruff Horn Beginning at a Large Pine and Stake (Chasite
the Mouth of Duckhead Run) with three hundred and
Twenty Poles to a Large Gum in Drowning Creek Swamp
then West One hundred and fifty five Poles to a Stake
then South three hundred and Twenty Poles to a Stake
then East One hundred and fifty five Poles to the
Beginning

as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods,
Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the
said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said

John Brown his Heirs and
Affairs, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money
yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may
direct. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said *John Brown*

shall cause this Grant to
be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of *Bladen*
within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise
the same shall be void and of no Effect.
