

To all to whom these Presents shall
come, Greeting.

K NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by *John Carruth*, have Given and Granted, and by these Presents do Give and Grant unto the said *John Carruth*, a Tract of Land, containing

Two hundred Acres, lying and being in our County of *Anson*.

On the West side of Paw Dees, Beginning at a Willow Oak on the River Bank, Jones old Corner then with his line West twenty four Chains to a Sweet Gum, Samuel Blackfords Corner then with his line North fifty eight Chains to a Stake in John Danoldson's line, then North fifty nine East sixteen Chains to a Stake in James Babers line, then with his line South Sixty East twenty four Chains to a Willow Oak Bush on the River Bank then down the various Courses of the River to the Beginning.

as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods, Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said

John Carruth his Heirs and Assigns, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may direct. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said *John Carruth*

shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of *Anson* within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void and of no Effect.
