come, Greeting.

K NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of
Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid
into our Treasury by *John Curbon*,
have Given and Granted, and by these
Presents do Give and Grant unto the said *John Curbon*
a Tract of Land, containing

Three hundred
Acres, lying and being in our County of *Anson*.
South West of the Decatur Still Branch of Mill Creek.
Beginning at a post Oak amongst two ^{Spanish} Oak trees and
a post Oak on the East Bank of said Branch and thence
thence North fifty five East fifty four Chains and Seventy
seven Links to a sourwood on the side of Reddy Branch
amongst three Sassafras a dogwood and Maple then
North thirty five West fifty four Chains and Seventy seven
Links to a stake and four black Jacks then South fifty
five West fifty four Chains and Seventy seven links to a
corner then South thirty five East fifty five Chains and twenty
seven Links to the Beginning.

as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods,
Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the
said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said *John*

Curbon his Heirs and
Affligns, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money
yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may
direct: PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said *John Curbon*

shall cause this Grant to
be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of *Anson*
within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise
the same shall be void and of no Effect.
