come, Greeting.

K NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by *John Thomas*,

have Given and Granted, and by these Presents do Give and Grant unto the said *John Thomas*,

Two hundred a Tract of Land, containing Acres, lying and being in our County of *Anson*—

On the West side of Gum Swamp on Painter Creek
Beginning at a pine amongst three pines on the Western
side of said Creek near the Provincial line and runs thence across
the North thirty nine East thirty Six Chains and fifty links
to a stake amongst three pines thence North fifty one West
fifty six Chains to a pine amongst three pines thence South
thirty Nine West thirty six Chains and fifty links to a
corner then South fifty one East fifty six Chains to
the Beginning.

as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear, together with all Woods, Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said *John Thomas*,

his Heirs and Affsins, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may direct: PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said *John Thomas*,

shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of *Anson* within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void and of no Effect.
