**K** NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by Robert Brasley have Given and Granted, and by these Presents do Give and Grant unto the said Robert Brasley a Tract of Land, containing

One hundred Acres, lying and being in our County of Bladen

On the Horse Shoe Beginning on the North side of  
Shades Swamp at a Red Oak and running  
One hundred and Twenty seven Poles to a Pine thence  
South One hundred and Twenty seven Poles  
to a Stake by a Water Oak in the edge of Shades Swamp  
thence West thro the said Swamp One hundred  
and Twenty seven Poles to a Stake, thence Due  
North One hundred and Twenty seven Poles  
to the Beginning

as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods, Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the said Land and belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said

Robert Brasley his Heirs and Assigns, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may direct. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said

shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of Bladen within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void and of no Effect.
