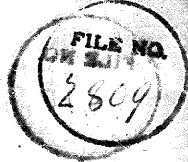


To all to whom these Presents shall
come, Greeting.



K NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of
Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid
into our Treasury by *Thomas Amey*

have Given and Granted, and by these
Presents do Give and Grant unto the said *Thomas Amey*
a Tract of Land, containing

One hundred
Acres, lying and being in our County of *Bladen*

*On the East side of Drumming Creek Beginning at a small
Red Oak about three hundred Yards below the Mouth of
Roxy Branch Running South One hundred and Twenty Seven
Poles to a Stake in a Large Bay then West One hundred
and Twenty Seven Poles to a Stake and two Lines and a
Red Oak then North One hundred and Twenty Seven Poles
to a Stake in Drumming Creek Swamp East One
hundred and Twenty Seven Poles to the Beginning.*

as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods,
Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the
said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said

Thomas Amey his Heirs
and Assigns, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money
yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may
direct. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said

Thomas Amey shall cause this Grant to be
registered in the Register's Office of our said County of *Bladen*
within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise
the same shall be void and of no Effect.
