come, Greeting.

**K** NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of  
Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid  
into our Treasury by William Tolson  
have Given and Granted, and by these  
Presents do Give and Grant unto the said William Tolson  
a Tract of Land, containing  
One hundred and forty  
Acres, lying and being in our County of Bladen

On the West side of Drowning Creek and on the West  
side of Hog Swamp Between Samuel Britts Line  
and William Tolson's Line Running South fifteen feet  
One hundred and Sixty Poles to a Stake and two  
Pines, then West One hundred and forty Poles  
to a Stake and a small Red Oak Bush, then North  
Twenty East One hundred and Sixty Poles to a Stake  
at Hog Swamp then East One hundred and  
Thirty Two Poles to the Beginning

as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods,  
Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the  
said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said

William Tolson his Heirs and  
Assigns, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money  
yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may  
direct. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said William Tolson

shall cause this Grant to  
be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of Bladen  
within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise  
the same shall be void and of no Effect.
