K NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by *William Mayo*, have Given and Granted, and by these Presents do Give and Grant unto the said *William Mayo*, a Tract of Land, containing

Two Hundred

Acres, lying and being in our County of

Anson

South West of Pe Deed on Dumass Creek the Waters of Brown Creek Beginning at a stake amonged a White Oak Red Oak and Sassafras pointers William Mayo third Corner and Running thence North twenty eight West twelve Chains and fifty links to a stake the third Corner of a hundred Acres Survey of said Mayo then with that line South twenty West thirty one Chains and Sixty three Links to his Second Corner then with his other line North twenty West Nineteen Chains and thirty Eight links to a stake then the Course of Walker Cunningham's marked trees South ten and a half West sixty Chains to a Corner then South fifty four East twenty six Chains and fifty links to a Corner in John Jarman's line then with his line South thirty one East six Chains and fifty links to a stake and over black Jacks then with his other line South twenty three and a half East twenty five Chains to a stake then with his other line South twenty four and fifty links to a stake and over black Jacks then with his other line North thirty one West thirty three Chains to a stake then North thirty one East Eighty Chains to the Beginning.
