To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

K NOW YE, That We, for and in Consideration of the Sum of Fifty Shillings for every Hundred Acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by Zachariah Johnston, have Given and Granted, and by these Presents do Give and Grant unto the said Zachariah Johnston, a Tract of Land, containing Two Hundred Acres, lying and being in our County of Anson.

South West of little Bee Deed, on a branch of the Beaver dam Beginning at a stake and four pines Stephen Herring second corner and Running with his line South Sixteen East fifteen chains and twenty five links to a stake and three black oaks in said line then North twenty four East twenty six chains and fifty links to a stake amongst three pines in John Herring's line then with his line North fifteen West twenty five chains to his corner continuing the same course five chains to a stake and three pines then South twenty five West thirty chains to a pine amongst three pines near a branch then North sixteen West seventeen chains and twenty links to a pine amongst three pines at or near Greens line then South twenty four West thirty nine chains and fifty links to a stake and three pines then South sixteen East fifteen chains and fifty links to a corner then South forty five East eighteen chains and fifty links to a stake Herring's Beginning corner then with his line North twenty four East thirty one chains and sixty three links to the beginning as by the Plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all Woods, Waters, Mines, Minerals, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances, to the said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said Zachariah Johnston his Heirs and Assigns, for ever. Yielding and paying to us such Sums of Money yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from Time to Time may direct. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That the said Zachariah Johnston shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of Anson within Twelve Months from the Date hereof, otherwise the same shall be void and of no Effect.
