Provided in clause 8th

I give and bequeath to my son W. C. Page that tract of land wherein I now reside containing 157 acres more or less together with all the buildings and improvements thereon. My will and desire is that all my personal property be sold and that the debts owing to me be collected and if there be any sum plus cost and above the payment of debts, expenses and legacies that such surplus shall be equally divided between my wife and all my children in equal portion share and share alike to them and every one of them, their executors and assigns.

8th

My will is that my wife Sarah in case she shall be living shall enjoy a lifetime estate in my real estate and that my son W. C. Page shall secure to her a comfortable living. And I hereby constitute my friend Charles P. Parker my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same.
