6th Item. To my daughter Mariak Luman I have advanced the following negroes to wit. Mars. Tom. Cunoib, Aaron, and Tiley which I wish in the division of my personal estate to be valued at nine hundred dollars.

7th Item. To my daughter Enolue Toddinger I have advanced the following negroes to wit. Solomon, and Charlotte, which I wish in the division of my personal estate to be valued at seven hundred dollars.

8th Item. To my daughter Lucy McDaniel I have advanced the following negroes to wit. Margaret, and Hardy. which I wish in the division of my personal estate to be valued at eight hundred dollars.

9th Item. It is my will and desire that all my personal property of every description whatever not otherwise disposed of shall be so divided among my children. Heaps to Shipman, Mariak Luman, Cydeline Toddinger, Lucy McDaniel, Emily McDaniel, John D. Shipman, Floride D. Shipman, Edmund S. Shipman, and James H. Shipman taking into consideration the advancements heretofore made, as to make each and every share equal laying in the negroes a moderate valuation.

I constitute and nominate my friend Richard Hooten, Executor and my beloved wife Rebecca Shipman, Executrix to this my last will and testament.

1st I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary two cows and calves, remaining at Job Culbraiths and one cow and yearling and one three year old steer remaining at John McChes, and one three year old steer remaining at David Johnsons, also half of the hogs that Job Culbraith is now raising on stock, also one bed and furniture and Bedstead and small chest, and one brooding wheel and carts, and one swan pot, also one note on John McChes, and one note on David Johnson.

Also I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Janetta Culbraith, one bridle, one horse, one calf and one yearling, and their increase.

Also I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Henrietta Culbraith one spanned or harnessed cow and calf and one yearling.

Also one servd mare I bequeath unto my son Job Culbraith, also I desire for my cart and plantation tools, and some household furniture to be sold at sundry and money divided among my legal heirs. And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends John McChes, and Job Culbraith, Executors to this my last will and testament.
