I Broughton Singletary of the State of North
Carolina of Bladen being weak in body but in perfect
mind and memory and understanding do constitute
this my last Will and Testament, and as touching my
worldly estate where with it hath pleased God to bless
me in this life I devise and dispose of in the fol-
lowing manner and form. VIZ=

I give unto my beloved Wife Mary Singletary all
her Possessions Real and Personal. that she was
possessed of at the day of our marriage to dispose
of it in what manner she thinks proper, and the
remainder of my estate to continue in my wife's
possession until my son Joseph Singletary comes
to be twenty one years of age then to be equally
divided between my three children Joseph Singletary
Deborah Singletary Benjamin Singletary and
for my wife to keep Benjamin part in her pos-
session until he is twenty one years of age and
if there should be a necessity to sell any of the
negroes to pay my debts let it be a negro girl
named Amy and if she is sold it is in the
power of my Executors and Executrix to sell her
or any of my property at Public or Private sale
as they may think proper to pay my debts and
I hereby constitute and appoint my brother Benjamin
Singletary and my beloved Wife Mary Singletary
my Executors and Executrix of this my last

The 4th day of July in the Year of Our Lord 1792
I Joseph Singletary of the County of Bladen and
Province of North Carolina being of perfect mind
and memory and understanding do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament to

Imprimus It is my Will and I do order that
in the first place all my just debts and funeral
charges be first paid and satisfied

It is my Will and desire that my children shall be
educated out of my whole estate what and my Ex-
ecutors hereafter mentioned shall think sufficient.

It is my Will and desire that my beloved Wife
Mary Singletary enjoy my whole estate both Real
and Personal. during her Widowhood except the
schooling of the children but in case she marries that
immediately after that she is to have one third part
of all the remainder of my movable or personal
estate laid off to her by my Executors hereafter
mentioned. To her her heirs and assigns forever

It is my Will and desire the other two thirds

my personal estate likewise all my Real estate be equally divided amongst my Children when the youngest arrives at the age of fourteen years old but in case this mother is living in Widdowood the Real estate not to be divided while she remains in that State to them their heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever.

And I do hereby disavow revoke and disannul all other former wills by me made and I do declare this and no other to be my last will and Testament.

And I do hereby nominate ordain and appoint my two Brothers Benjamin Fitz Randolph and Johannes Singletary to be my true and lawful and whole Executors of this my last will and Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first writ in witness.

North Carolina - The substance of the last will and Testament of Thomas White of the County of Bladen and Province of Maryland deceased as near as the Subscriber who wrote the same can remember.

Impensis. He willed his plantation and mill where he lived to be sold and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided between his wife Ann White his son Joseph White and his two daughters Sarah and Mary White.

He willed and bequeathed his land known as Bonahoe Bluff to his son Joseph White to have his heirs and assigns forever.

He gave a negro girl named Phillis and a Pine Desk to his daughter Sarah White.

He gave a Negro girl named Atancey Subash to his son Joseph White.

He gave a negro girl named Betty to his daughter Mary White.

He willed that his said wife should have the use of his whole estate both Real and Personal except the negro girl named Phillis, and Pine Desk during her widowhood and no longer.

He willed and bequeathed all the rest and residue of his personal estate whatsoever to be equally divided between his said wife Ann White his son Joseph White and also his two daughters Sarah and Mary White.

He nominated and appointed his wife Ann White Executrix and his friend John Bryant Executor of that his last will and Testament. Witness the 3^d 1768.
