named Gabriel.

I give and bequeath unto my Brother Franklin
Taylor Cromartie, my Stock in the Wilmington &
Raleigh Rail Road.

I give and bequeath unto my Brothers James
William Cromartie, John Quincy, Franklin Taylor
and Luther all my lands to be equally di-
vided among them. Said lands not to be
sold out of the family.

I give and bequeath unto my said Brothers
all my Stock of Horses, Cattle Hogs Sheep, to
be equally divided among them.

My Household and Kitchen Furniture and what
more is not particularly mentioned. I wish to be equal-
ly divided among my above named Brothers.

I wish each of my brothers to pay into the hands
of my Executor One hundred dollars, each out of
my Estate. said money to be appropriated towards
the Education of Julia Robinson daughter of George
and Phoebe Robinson.

Should my Executor think proper said money may
be appropriated towards the Purchase of a negro
for the use of the said Julia Robinson.

I hereby make and appoint my Brother James
William Cromartie my Executor of this my last
Will and Testament.

have to this my last Will and Testament set my
hand and seal. This day and Year above Written.
