

In the Name of God Amen

I Isaac King of the County of Bladen and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of perfect Strength of mind and disposing memory and coming to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die do constitute and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following: viz-

First and principally I give and bequeath my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Heirs and Executors, hereafter named and as to my worldly goods that it hath pleased God to give me with - I give and bequeath in manner and form following:

That is to say in three equal parts, one third of all my land meadows and every other property I have I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lydia the lands to return to my Son after her decease and the rest I have left her to be disposed of as she may think proper, and the other two thirds of my estate I leave equally divided among all my children the land to be divided amongst my sons and the rest of the two thirds of my property above named I order it to be equally divided among all my sons and my daughters, my just debt to be paid out of the several Estates above named and my youngest children that is not educated to be educated out of my share part of the estate.

I do hereby appoint and ordain my Son Alexander King and William White to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament as faithful Executors, and I hereby revoke all other Wills by me made, do confirm this to be my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal the 24th day of June 1793

The 7th day of March 1788. being sick in body but of good and sound memory thanks be to almighty and coming to remembrance the uncertain state of this transitory life and that all flesh must yield to death when it shall please God to call, do make constitute ordain and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following revoking and disannulling by these presents all and every Testament or Testament will or wills heretofore by me made or declared in this by word or writing and this only to be taken for my last Will and Testament and now order and first being penitent and sorry from the bottom of my heart for my sins, first most humbly desire forgiveness for the same.

I give and commit my Soul to almighty God, my Saviour and Redeemer, in whom and by the merit of Jesus Christ, I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and that my Soul with my body at the general day of resurrection, shall rise again with joy and through the merit of Christ, death and passion pass over and inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his elect and chosen, and my body to be buried in such a place where it shall please my Executors hereafter named to appoint and now for the settling of my temporal estate and such goods, chattels and debts, as has pleased God for above my deserts to bestow, upon I do ordain give and dispose of the same in manner following. That is to say,

First

I will that all those debts and dues as I owe to any one person or persons, whatsoever, should be paid within convenient time after my death by my Executors hereafter named, which is my Son Daniel Kinn and Elizabeth Kinn my daughters to execute and divide my temporal estate according to this my last Will.

First I give unto my James Kinn the one half of my land whereon I do dwell now which is 80 acres the dividing line to run partly east and west, and 100 acres adjoining on the back of it, and my Son James shall have the upper half Northward to him and his heirs forever.

his mother to have it in her possession to live on during her widowhood, and no longer, and James when he comes of age shall pay to his brother Daniel Thim fifteen pounds good and lawful money of this State and the other part of the land I do give to Daniel Thim Junior Son of John Thim to him and his heirs forever, his father saying to Daniel Thim Jun^r fifteen pounds good and lawful money of this State.

And to my daughter Elizabeth I give four cows and calves, and six two year old heifers and her horse and saddle one feather bed and furniture and big pot, and the remainder of my household estate.

I give unto my beloved wife Mary Thim during her widowhood to dispose of as she may think proper, but if she should marry again what she has in her hands shall be equally divided between James, Charity, Mary and Catherine.

The 3rd day of September 1783 I Lemard Lock of the State of North Carolina and County of Bladen, being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore saying unto mind the mortalities of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all.

I give and recommend my soul unto the Hands of God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

Imprimis, I give or lend to my beloved wife Rebecca Lock, the plantation whereon I now live and also all my negroes, and their increase with all the rest of my household goods and plantation tools, cattle and hogs, and horses, that is not heretofore mentioned, during her widowhood or life.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Lock, one horse that is named Rose and also one feather bed, and furniture and half a dozen painted plates, fowls.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Lock, one horse that is named Rose, and also one feather bed and furniture and half a dozen painted plates, fowls.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Lock, one feather bed and furniture fowls -

I give and bequeath to my daughter Sallie Lock, one feather bed and furniture fowls.

I give and bequeath to my son Lemard Lock the lower part of my land in the River that is so named after his mother is done with it.

I give and bequeath to my son John Lock the upper part of my land in the River that is so named after his mother is done with it.
