

## RECORD OF WILLS.

Will of Dugald McKeithan

In the name of God, Amen, the twenty first  
Day of January 1756/51 I Dugald McRithan of Bladen  
County in the province of North Carolina, Taylor,  
being very sick & weak in Body, but of perfect mind  
& memory, thanks be given unto God therefor calling to  
mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that is  
appointed for all men once to die, do make & Ordain this  
my last will & Testament: Principally, and first of all,  
I give & recommend my soul into the hands of God that  
gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to  
be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion  
of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the General  
resurrection I shall receive the same again by the  
mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate  
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this  
life, I give and devise and dispose of the same in the  
following manner and form -

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary McKittrick  
two Negro men viz. Old Jack & \_\_\_\_\_ five Cows &  
Calves, two Horses named Buck & \_\_\_\_\_ one feather bed  
and furniture & two large painted dishes, one small, one larger  
Beacon & one small D<sup>o</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ one Pott, one new Tea  
Kettle, one Chest & Trunk with all her wearey apparel \_\_\_\_\_  
nominate & appoint her the said Mary & Alexander McKittrick to be  
my Executress.

I give and bequeath to my beloved Child that my  
dearly beloved wife Mary McKeithan now goes with if safely  
delivered whether male or female, two negro men called  
Young Horse, two Breeding Mares

acres of land where I live on beginning at Mr. Rowan's upper line & running upward fronting the river and running one mile back it is my desire that the Negro Called Dick be sold and two negro girls bought with the money for the use of said Child, which Child & Interest I leave to the care of my wife Mary aforesaid while she remaineth on the aforesaid land, if she removeth off the said land the Child with the above said - to be left with my dearly beloved Abby & J. McRishen if living at the time and to be left with the rest of kindred on Cape Fear the said

Child to be set free at the age of twenty one years and to receive his or her estate if it please God there should be twins or less children the \_\_\_\_\_ estate to be equally divided between them. It's also my desire that the land work on the sd. plantation except \_\_\_\_\_ for the space of five years and the profits of the same to discharge debts which are now or may become incurred by reason of money expended not yet mentioned.

I also desire that the sd negro men called Young Jacob should be sold at the end of five years & two young negro girls bought for the money they  
of the sd. Child or Children. It's also my will & pleasure  
the aforesd. Child or Children should die before they arrive  
the age of twenty one years that one of sd. Negro girls be  
given to my beloved wife Mary McKeithan and the remainder part  
of sd. Negro all - Chattels laid out for sd. Children to  
be equally divided between the Children of my beloved  
sons James McKeithan and Duncan McKeithan, Nancy  
McKeithan & Sarah McKeithan any of the sd. persons  
dying without issue this part to be equally divided  
between the next heirs of kindred

I will and desire that the aforementioned Land \_\_\_\_\_ the aforementioned Child or Children & the Heir or Heirs of my body should not live to years of maturity that then the sd. land to be given to my beg. James McKeithan son to my beloved brodr. James McKeithan.

I give to my beloved Father Donald McKeithan one feather bed my young bay horse in \_\_\_\_\_ on cow & Calf

I give to my Beloved brother James McElroy 160 acre land wherein he now liveth & the rest of the legacy here after mentioned after paying the debts aforesaid to be

I give & Bequeath to my beloved — John McKeishan  
my beloved — James McKeishan aforesaid. One Cow & Calf  
to each of them —————— to them and their heirs.

I give a Bequest to my beloved Alex Daniels

I give to my sister Nancy Mc Lanchan & her heirs for  
ever one Cow & Calf with their increase

Item I give to my beloved sister Sarah McKeithan one Cow & Calf to her and her Heirs for ever.  
 Item I give to Mary McKeithan Daughter to Donald McKeithan one Cow & Calf to her & her Heirs for ever.  
 Item I give & bequeath to the Daughter of Alexs McKeithan one Cow & Calf wth her increase to her & her Heirs.  
 Item I will & bequeath to my beloved son in Law Robert Hilliard Junior son to John Hilliard North-Hampton County deceased one young Iron gray Mare. one feather Bed.  
 Item It is my will & pleasure that my plantation on R... quis Swamp on \_\_\_\_\_ river be sold containing four hundred & fort acres, to pay and discharge my first mentioned debts and a plantation in South Carolina be also sold containing 394 acre of land by deed and patent be it more or less the sd money to be out in young \_\_\_\_\_ slaves for use of the aforementioned Infant or Infants the Heirs of my body & their Heirs forever.

And I do hereby revoke & disannull all other former Wills and Testaments, ratifying & Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seals the day and year above written.

## Will of James Carver

The Last Will & Testament of James Carver of Bladen County in the province of North Carolina this twenty seven the day of February one thousand seven hundred and fifty three, who being very sick and weak in Body but in perfect mind and memory thanks be to God do recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it hoping for a glorious Resurrection by his power, and my Body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors and as for my worldly Estate I give and bequeath in manner and form following Imprimis I will and desire that all my just debts be paid.

Item I give and bequeath to our society of People called Quakers two acre of land whereon the meetinghouse now stands to be laid out for the use of the meetinghouse and a grave yard to the aforesaid Society of people & their Heirs for ever.

Item I give to my Beloved Wife Elizabeth Carver a good Horse to be bought at the discretion of my Executors & her side saddle & Bridle and one feather Bed and furniture belonging to it and one desk and one tea chest and one large Bible.

Item My Will & desire is that after the term of three years is expired that my Executors if they think it best & more to advantage may sell my half of the saw mill and the land I now live on & if opportunity presents or offers to buy a good piece of Land and build a good house thereon with the said money which said land and house I give and bequeath to my son Job Carver his Heirs & assigns for ever.

Item My will & desire is that my true and loving wife have a good sufficient room in the aforesaid House and one third part of the land that is bought for my son Job and the other two thirds to be delivered to him when he is of age.

Item I give to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Carver one riding horse, side saddle and one feather Bed and furniture.

Item I will and desire that the fifty acres of land I belong of Thomas Davis be sold by my Executors and I give one half of the money to my Brother Samuel Carver and the other half to be for the use of the Estate to pay debts.
