I Duncan Lament, planter in Bladen County and State of North Carolina through the abundant mercy of God get the more in body get to perfect understanding and memory blessed be God do constitute to this my last will and Testament as follows.

Impressum I humbly bequeath my Soul to Almighty God my Maker beseeching his most gracious acceptance of it through the merits of, and mediation of my most compassionate Redeemer, Jesus Christ.

I order that all my lawful debts be paid in the first place.

I order one Cow for my eldest daughter, Marian, David McMillans wife.

I order one Cow and calf for my eldest son August Lament.

I order one two year old Rifer for my daughter Mary with what she got already.

I order one Cow and yearling to my daughter, Eliza.

I order the one half of a two year old Mare to my son David, and the other half for my two youngest daughters, Margaret and Elizabeth. I order the one gray Mare the one half of her for my eldest son August and the other half for my son Duncan.

I order my Horse and half of my plantation and half of the Woods land to my beloved wife Christiana Lament for life time and then to return to my son Duncan, his heirs and assigns and the other half of my plantation and Woods land to my son David his heirs and assigns.

I order my Horse and all the plantation tools to my beloved wife Christiana Lament. I order one Bed and furniture one Chest one Bureau wheel to my beloved wife Christiana Lament.

I order one Bore and Lamb to my step daughter Christiana Munn. I order the one third part of the stock of my stock of Cattle Hogs and sheep and divided for future to my beloved wife Christiana Lament and the rest to be divided between my four youngest children.

I order my body clothes to my son August Lament.

I give full power to David Taylor and Duncan McMillan Executors along with my beloved wife

In the Name of God "Amen"

I Joseph Rump of the County of Bladen being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this the 21st day of February in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five, make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say.

That all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my stock of Cattle and Hogs.

It was I give and bequeath to my Grand son Joseph Richard Rump the plantation whereon I now live also my negro person Harry to him and the heirs of his body but if the said Joseph Richard should die without lawful heirs, in that case the plantation and said negro is to go to his uncle John Rump, and the heirs of his body.

It was I give and bequeath to my son David White Rump two hundred acres of land in two surveys lying back of the plantation I now live on, also one bed and furniture, which he has in possession, one horse the oldest and one half of my stock of Cattle and Hogs and half of plantation tools and half of my household furniture which I do not otherwise dispose of, and the one half of a still, also a negro girl Jane, which I have made a deed of gift of to him.

"It was" I give and bequeath to my son William Rump two hundred and fifty acres of land being the lower part of two hundred acres lying in Dutch Branch, also a bed and furniture which he has in possession.
