of North Carolina, do make public and declare this
my last Will and Testament in manner and form
following, to wit, "

June 1st. It is my will and desire that all my just
debt be paid.

June 2^d I give and bequeath to my Brother John
Singletary, James B. Singletary, Evan Singletary, Orrin
Singletary, Fitz Randolph Singletary, and my Sister
Mary Howell, and my wife Louisa Howell their Ex-
ecutors and administrators my Negro, Slave, John
and all my other property of whatsoever kind
and description to be sold, by Executors herein
after named, in a credit of six months, and
the proceeds thereof after payment of my debts
be equally divided among them.
And it is my wish and desire that my Executors
hereafter to be named, shall immediately after my
death, take up my estate in possession and move
it off the premises for the safe keeping thereof,
until such time as they can lawfully dispose
of it.

Lastly, I nominate constitute and appoint my friends James H. Benson, and James Robinson Jr of this County and State as aforesaid, Executors to this my last Will and Testament.
