I Frederick Miller, of the County of Bladen
and State of North Carolina being weak in
Health of body but of sound and disposing
mind and memory do make ordain and publish
this to be my last will and testament in Form
and manner following Viz'

I give and bequeath to my daughter Emily R.
Gause during her life the following negro slaves
namely - Old John and his wife Sophia. Hannah.
Lelia. Israel. Robert. Jacob. Rebecca and Siannah
and their increase including as well the children
drew that have been born to the said negroes since
they have been in the possession of the said Emily
R. Gause. or any increase as they may thereafter
have which said negroes that the said Emily R.
Gause has received estimated at a value of
the sum of One Thousand and Twenty Dollars and
on the death of my daughter Emily R. Gause
it is my will and desire that the negroes given
to her during her life shall be equally divided
among and between her children. -

I give and bequeath to my daughter Jane A.
Byrne. During her life the following negro slaves
namely - Dick. Venus. Abby. Peagon. and their
increase including as well the children that
have been born to the said negroes since they have
been in the possession of the said Jane A. Byrne
as any increase they may thereafter have which
said negroes. the said Jane A. Byrne has received
estimated in value at the sum of One thousand four
hundred and fifty dollars. and on the death of my
daughter Jane A. Byrne it is my will and desire
that the negroes given to her during her life shall
be equally divided among and between her children
I also give and bequeath to my daughter Jane. negro
woman "Mary" whom she has received in addition
to the above described negroes. but not to be considered
as any part of her distributive share of my property.

I give and bequeath to my grandson William
Miller during his life the following negro

Mars. Namby - Peter. Friday. John Jim. and Nancy.
and their increase which said negroes the said William
L. Miller has received estimated in value at the sum
of One thousand Eight hundred and thirty five dollars
and on the death of my son William L. Miller it is
my will and desire that the negroes given to them
during his life shall be equally divided among and
between his children.

I give and bequeath to my grand son William L.
Gilmore during his life the following negro slaves and
their increase namely - Sambo and his wife
Lucy. and their child, in named Sam. Bois. Washington
Nancy and Harry also old Hicks daughter. Namah -
estimated in value at the sum of One thousand eight
hundred. and twenty five dollars. and on the death of
my Grandson William L. Gilmore, it is my will and
desire that the negroes given to him during his life
shall be equally divided among and between my children
Viz' Emily R. Gause. Jane A. Byrne and William L.
Miller. provided that the said William L. Gilmore leaves
at his decease no children living of his own.

I give and bequeath to my son William L. Miller
during his life the lower part of my plantation known
as the Hill land. estimated in value at the sum
of Seven hundred and thirty five dollars. and on
the death of my son William L. Miller it is my
will and desire that the said land be equally
divided among and between his children.

I give and devise to my grandson William L. Gilmore
during his life the residue of my Manor plantation
consisting of the piece or parcel known as the Hill
land. and the piece or parcel known as the
Pencill land estimated together in value at the sum
of Eight hundred dollars. and on the death of my
Grandson William L. Gilmore it is my will and
desire that the last described two pieces of land
shall be equally divided among my children Emily
R. Gause. Jane A. Byrne and William L. Miller
provided that the said William L. Gilmore leaves at
his decease no living children.

I give and devise to my daughter Jane A. Byrne

during her life a piece or parcel of land in Cumberland County situated on Willis Creek, joining McMillan the said land containing three hundred acres more or less, which I purchased from James Sims, estimated in value at the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars. And on the death of my daughter Jane A. Byrne it is my will and desire that the said land be equally divided among and between her children.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Emily R. Gause certain monies collected by her husband Mr. J. J. Gause, from Mr. Lord, and Mr. Still making the sum of six hundred dollars which said sum I desire as her distribution share of my landed property I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Hannah Miller, one horse my big and harness, and all the notes remaining in my possession that are not taken for the sum of negroes, Tom John Joe Primrose, Hannah, and Annie.

I will and desire that the residue of my property consisting of Old Bicks, Bick Sam, Rose Jack, Hunter Bullard, Gold Julius, Lucy, Peter, Dick Hindman, Late Mary Juda, Tom Bob and Kitkey together with all the rest and residue of my personal and real estate to be equally divided, after first making up out of the last mentioned negroes and other property the several sums requisite to make equal the share of each respective legatee in the division of both real and personal properties among and between my children Emily R. Gause, Jane A. Byrne and William L. Miller, and William L. Silmore, to be held and owned by them during their lives, and on their death or on the death of any of said children, Emily R. Gause, Jane A. Byrne, William L. Miller and William L. Silmore it is my will and desire that the share of said dead be equally divided among and between his or her children.

The share of William L. Silmore given to him during his life in this last lot of property it is my will and desire on his death to be equally

divided among and between my children Emily R. Gause, Jane A. Byrne and William L. Miller, provided the said William L. Silmore dies without leaving children of his own at his decease.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons William L. Miller and James A. Byrne executors of this my last will and testament, at the same time revoking all other wills made by me in witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this the 4th day of April 1834

I Joseph Chance of the County of Bladen and State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound and perfect mind and memory. Blessed be almighty God for it, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is to say)

In the first place I leave unto my beloved wife Mary Chance the whole of my real and personal estate during her widowhood, if she should marry then to draw an equal share with the whole of the heirs.

I give and bequeath unto my four sons, Daniel M. Chance, Joshua L. Chance, Joseph J. Chance, and David P. Chance, the whole of my lands.

The rest of my property to be equally divided among the whole of my heirs, only fifty dollars extraordinary to each of my six daughters, Anna Weston, Fannie Butler, Patience Chance, Dorcas Chance, Elizabeth Chance, and Mary H. Chance, provided John Weston husband of the above mentioned Fannie Butler shall pay up one hundred and fifty dollars for a fine,
