of Dugald's Little Marsh including thereunto  
whereon William Collier now lies with his wife  
and children to be divided out of the choice of the  
book or the place to be kept with their money  
in the same time he comis of age to him and  
his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my Son Philip Knob  
one hundred acres of land South Side of the  
Big Marsh, being the land I bought of Isaac Kennedy  
with one hundred acres joining it to be taken up  
if the offices is opened in good terms with five  
Acres and Cattus as good as any in the State.

I give and bequeath to my dear beloved Husband  
One hundred acres of land on Hog Run branch being  
a branch of Rock fish and the same give me by my  
dearly Beloved Phillip Hunt, with fifteen pounds freight and  
and five good arms and accres to him and his  
heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my true beloved wife Dorothy  
Kuer, 10 Cows and Calves and all the House  
hold furniture with the work of my Negro Goats  
as long as she lives a third to herself the children  
and in case she marries for to Rose her third of  
the legacy and the other two thirds to be equally divided  
between my three children.  
Also give to my wife the Bay Mare and all the Hogs  
for the use of the family. the remaining part of my  
stock that is not mentioned in any part of my will  
to be sold to pay my debt, and funeral charges  
and to pay the fifteen pounds mentioned to be  
given to my Son Solomans. The remaining part of  
which will forty pounds broke to be equally divided  
between my wife and my three Sons.  
And Lastly I do stipulate and appoint my true beloved  
wife Dorothy Kuer and Henry Nesson, my whole &  
sole Executor and Executor to this my last will and  
Testament. Wim under my hand and seal this the 10th  
day of May anno Domini 1770.

The said Joining in the second Legacy and the said a widow  
in the 4<sup>th</sup> Legacy interdicted before signed also the work  
part of my estate present.
