I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife
Catherine Shaw sole executrix of this my last
will and testament with direction to my said
Executrix to defray my funeral charges, and
discharge all my just debts, after which I
devise that all the rest of my property be at the
entire disposal of my said executrix, discharging
all other wills heretofore made.

will and testament hereby revoking all former
wills by me made in testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this third day
of August 1797. ninety seven and in the
twenty second year of our Independence.

This my last will and Testament and principally first of all I give and recommend my soul to the hands of God that gave it, and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian, decent manner at the discretion of my Executor nothing doubting but that at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life.

I give devise and dispose of the same in manner and form following. viz:-

Item 1st I give unto Sarah my dear beloved wife for and during her natural life my plantation with its improvements with all my personal property, whatever viz:- my stock, Cattle, hogs, furniture, tools &c.

Item I give my daughter Sarah Yedder after the death of Sarah her mother one chest, iron box, one pewter dish, one do basin, one plate, 3 spoons, one feather bed and bedstead one wheel and Cards forever.

Item I give to my two sons George and William and my daughter Elizabeth Yedder after the death of their mother, three pewter basins, three plates, one tin quart and funnel and six spoons one feather bed and bedstead forever.

Item I give to my son Samuel Yedder after the death of his mother Sarah my wife all my Cattle with all and singular my personal property whatsoever not being otherwise willed, or disposed of former, and I hereby constitute and appoint my son George Yedder executor to this my last will and Testament, revoking all others and confirming this only wherein I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day of January 1796.

In the name of God Amen

The 7th day of September in the year of our Lord 1795 I George Pader of the County of Bladen and State of North Carolina planter being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of God who gave it, and for my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like decent manner, at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in manner and form following.

That is to say in the first place I give and bequeath to Mary my dearly beloved wife all and singular my lands and all and every part of my property during her natural life, also at my wife's death I give and bequeath to my well beloved sons, Jesse and Thomas all of my lands then and their heirs forever, also I give unto all my Children at my wife's death an equal part of all my movable property to be equally divided among them boys and girls.

Also I do hereby constitute make and ordain my well beloved brother William and Samuel Yedder executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every former Testament Wills and Legacies, bequests and executors by me in any voyage before this time named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal.

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
