1787

In the name of God Amen.
 I Richard Smith of Bladen County and state
 of North Carolina being sick and weak of body
 but of sound and disposing mind and memory
 do make this my last will and Testament in
 manner following to wit -

First

Secondly

I desire all my just debts and funeral charge
 may be paid by my Executors hereafter mentioned.
 I give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife
 Lucy Smith the land and plantation wherein I
 shall die together with one negro wench Phillis during
 her widowhood and after her marriage or decease
 I give devise and bequeath the same to my son
 Macon Smith to him and to his heirs forever.

Also I give to my said wife two of the best feather
 beds and furniture I did possess of and a choice
 part of the rest of the household furniture and stock
 of cattle and hogs &c that I shall die possessed of.

It is also my desire that should be above named
 negro wench Phillis need to the amount of four shillings
 given that my son Tyron shall have the two first and
 my son Noble the other two, to be delivered to him at
 a year old each. It is also my desire that after
 my decease my executors may hire out the runaway
 negroes & may die possessed of if the negroes should
 not be agreeable to my said wife to keep the money for
 the support of my family.

Also it is my desire that the remainder of my
 estate be equally divided between the rest of my
 children viz - Elizabeth Mary Sarah & either Tyron
 Noble and Massy to them and their heirs and
 assigns forever.

And I hereby appoint my friends John Willis
 Eliza Burns and Samuel Porter Esquires Executors
 of this my last Will and Testament and revoking
 all former Wills by me made confirming this
 only to be my last Will and Testament.

 goodness of God though weak in body yet of a
 sound and perfect understanding and memory
 blessed be God for it, do make this my Last Will
 and Testament as followeth.

I order and desire all my lawful debts to be
 paid in the first place, afterwards I order and
 desire my dear and beloved wife Cathrine Stewart
 to have all my horses and cattle and sheep and
 hogs and all my household goods and all man-
 ner of movables whatsoever belonging to me to her
 Will and disposal. I order and desire my be-
 loved wife to have the plantation wherein I now
 live upon, containing a hundred acres of
 land with all the privileges thereto belonging
 during her life time and after her decease I
 order and desire the said plantation with
 all its rights and title to my dear brother
 Robert Stewart first lawfully male heir to him
 and his heirs, failing a male heir of my brother
 Robert I order and desire the above said
 plantation to my brother Robert's daughter Elizabeth
 Stewart to her and the heirs of her body.

I order and make my dear wife whole
 Executrix of this my last Will and Testa-
 ment.

I Brayton Singletary of the State of North Carolina of Bladen being make in body but in perfect mind and memory and understanding do constitute this my last Will and Testament, and as touching my worldly estate where with it hath pleased god to bless me in this life I desire and dispose of in the following manner and form. Viz=

I give unto my beloved wife Mary Singletary all her possessions Real and personal that she was possessed of at the day of our marriage to dispose of it in what manner she thinks proper, and the remainder of my estate to continue in my wife's possession until my son Joseph Singletary comes to be truly one years of age then to be equally divided between my three children Joseph Singletary Deborah Singletary Benjamin Singletary and for my wife to keep Benjamin's part in her possession until he is twenty one years of age and if this should be a necessity to sell any of the negroes to pay my debts let it be a negro girl named Anna and if she is sold it is in the power of my Executors and Executrix to sell her or any of my property at public or private sale as they may think proper to pay my debts and I hereby constitute and appoint my brother Benjamin Singletary and my beloved wife Mary Singletary my Executor and Executrix of this my last
