RECORD OF WILLS.

of my Executors hereafter named, as to my temporal estate I bequeath and dispose of it in the following manner namely.

In primitis. My will is that all my just debts be fully paid and discharged by my Executors hereafter named, with all convenient speed after my decease.

Item I give grant and bequeath unto my well beloved and loving son, Isaac Lock of the aforesaid County, 304 acres of land where I now live on the North east side of the Creek Met River.

Item I give grant and bequeath unto my well beloved and loving son Leonard Lock, one negro boy, Wm.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved and loving son Dr. Benjamin Ellerell, one negro boy named Kilbury.

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved and loving son Isaac, one negro boy named Harry.

I give grant and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna Lock all the rest of my Goods and Chattels, with the land before given to Isaac Lock, which she is to keep in full possession until deceased then passing them to the aforesaid Isaac Lock, and whereas breeding must often divide,

I do give grant and bequeath unto my beloved and loving daughter Susannah Lock, her first living Child, and the rest of her married any and other particulars not mentioned and the Marsh, to be equally divided among my heirs and Heires except the one half of a tract of land lying on the bank of Singletary Lake containing 300 acres, which I give grant and bequeath unto my beloved and loving son Leonard Lock.

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint for the aforesaid my well beloved and loving Mrs. Anna Lock, and my well beloved and loving son Leonard Lock to be my sole Executrix and Executor of this my last will and Testament.

I. Isaac Jones of Bladon County, being through the abundant mercy and goodness of God, though weak in body yet of sound mind and perfect understanding and memory do constitute this my last Will and Testament and desire that it may be recorded by all as such.

First - I most humbly bequeath my soul to god my maker, beseeching his most gracious acceptance of it, through the all sufficient merit and mediation of most omnipotent Redeemer Jesus Christ, who gave himself to be atonement for my sins.

I give my body to the earth from which it came in full assurance of its resurrection from hence at the last day, as for my burial, I desire it may be decent at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named. As to my worldly estate I will and positively order that all my just debts be paid and discharged.

I give to my son Edward Jones, my negro Peter and Prince and my negro Much and Phille also one third part of all my Household stuff to him his heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my son in Law Benjamin Humphrey the sum of One Shilling Sterling money.

I give to my son in Law Benjamin Biggs

the sum of six Shillings Sterling Money.

I give to my Son in Law John Stewart two cows and calves to him and his Heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my Son in Law Jacob Heward six Cows and calves to him and his Heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my Son Isaac Jones all the Plantation of land wherew I now live with all the new improvements. The Crops now on said lands excepted, also my Saw Mill and the land belonging to it, also fifty acres of land joining Dartmoor Lake also my three Negroes Bob. Miles and child Sam also my Milking Desk, and shot guns, also the one third part of all my Household stuff, to him his heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my Son Musgrave Jones, my Servt at Elizabeth Town and all the Lots I own in said Town, also all the other land I am possessed of not already bequeathed, also my three Negroes Bob. Jean and John, also my riding horse and saddle and my Silver Watch, and the one third part of my Household stuff, to him and his Heirs and assigns forever,

I give to my grand daughter Jean Humphrey when she shall come to eighteen years of age my two negroes and her child Bruce to her and her Heirs forever,

But if the said Jean Humphrey should die before she is eighteen years of age, then my will is that the said Lucy and Bruce and any children that the said Lucy may have, be equally divided between my two Sons, Isaac and Musgrave Jones, their Heirs and assigns forever,

I also give to my brothers Joseph Williams and Samuel Brightman my two negroes Slave and Tom, also all the Household stuff I had with their mother by marriage also one yoke of Oxen to them their Heirs and assigns forever. They the said Brightmans not to indemnify my Executors and their Heirs from all debts their mother made.

before I married her, and the remainder of my estate with the crop now on the ground after my debts are paid I give my Sons Isaac and Musgrave Jones.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint them Executors of this my last Will and Testament

very sick and weak in body but in perfect mind
and memory thanks be to god for the same and
my soul I recommend it to god that gave it and
my body I recommend it to the ground to be
buried in a Christian like and decent manner
at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the
same again and whenever it shall please god
to bless this world I do dispose of my worldly
goods in the manner and form following viz -

Item first. I give my lands containing 200
acres to be sold at Publice Sale and the money to
be equally divided between Jacob Lamb and Isaac
Lamb, after my decease and my Carter after my
decease to be equally divided between Jacob and
Isaac, only Thomas Clark is to have two acres
and Cows, and one Son and Daug. and all my
Hogs and Pors I give to the said Jacob and
Isaac, to be equally divided between them.
