In the name of God "Amen"  
 The twenty fifth day of June in the year of our Lord  
 one thousand eight hundred and thirteen and the 3<sup>rd</sup>  
 of American Independence.

J. Archibald Kelly Esq<sup>r</sup> of the State of North  
 Carolina and the County of Bladen Slabber,  
 being but weak in body but of perfect mind  
 and memory thanks be given unto Almighty God  
 therefore. Calling to mind the mortality of my  
 body knowing that it is appointed unto all men  
 once to die do make and ordain this my last will  
 and testament in manner and form following  
 viz:- One note on interest of eighty dollars against  
 Daniel Taylor one note on interest for forty dollars  
 against Archibald Campbell, one note on interest  
 for fifty four dollars and fifty one cents against Duncan  
 Ray first to deduct all just debts and charges  
 against my estate and twenty dollars for my  
 daughter Catherine Taylor out of the above mentioned  
 notes and the remainder to be equally divided  
 between my sons in law Daniel Taylor Archibald  
 Campbell, Duncan Ray and, Duncan Currie my  
 daughter Flora Campbell to have her mother's clock  
 My daughter Mary Ray one blanket and bed and  
 all the other note goods and chattels.

I give and bequeath to my son James Kelly Esq<sup>r</sup>  
 and Archibald Kelly Esq<sup>r</sup> to be equally divided between  
 them and their heirs forever.

The word Bladen in the sixth line and wrote them  
 in the twenty eighth line included before before  
 signed. I appoint my son James Kelly Esq<sup>r</sup> my  
 Executor

 weak of body and reflecting it is appointed for all men  
 once to die do therefore make and ordain this my  
 last will and testament in manner following viz-

- First I desire to resign my soul to Almighty God that  
 gave it in a happy resurrection.
- Secondly I desire my body to be returned to its mother earth  
 and buried in a Christian manner at the discretion  
 of my Executors here after named.
- Thirdly I desire that all my just debts be paid punctually  
 by and necessary dispatch.
- Fourthly I give and bequeath to the heir or heirs of my late  
 Nancy McGehee deceased twenty shillings to be  
 paid them on demand.
- Fifthly I desire that the remainder of my estate both  
 real and personal be agreeable to law be divided  
 amongst my surviving heirs viz:- My wife Nancy  
 my sons Thomas, James and Samuel.
- Sixthly I constitute and appoint my friend Bartram  
 Robison together with my two sons Thomas and James  
 my Executors of this my last will and Testament.
