I, Hugald McMillan of the County and State aforesaid being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind, and judgment do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following.

1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth McMillan a certain tract or parcel of Land wherein I now live conveyed by James Fleming to Hugald McMillan containing Two Hundred Acres for and during the term of her Natural life. I also give and bequeath unto my beloved wife three negroes - viz Jacob, Cady and Jack. during her natural life and at her death it is my will and desire that the above described property be taken into possession by my son Duncan and by him retained for the use and benefit of my daughter Susan during her Natural life. and after her death it is my will and desire that one half of which may be remaining be equally divided between my sons Duncan, McMillan and Hugald McMillan and the other half. I give in trust to John D. Brown, McMillan and my son Duncan McMillan and Cannon. to be applied only to the sole use and benefit of my three daughters. Elizabeth, Susan and Mary.
