It is my wish and desire that she be not hired out, until the death of my two sisters, Margaret Carr, and Elizabeth McMillan. I give and bequeath after my death, all my property of whatever kind to my nephew and niece, Daniel St. McMillan and Margaret Elizabeth McMillan, to be equally divided between them. It is my desire and wish that this division shall not take place until after the death of my two sisters now living with me. It is my wish and desire that Daniel St. McMillan my stepson should have as many children from Patsy, as one or two. It is my desire that the Rev. William Brodston be Executor and my co-Executor be my co-executors. And now I humbly commit myself soul and body into the hands of a merciful and God in Christ Jesus, my Lord humbly praying that he may save me with an everlasting salvation in Heaven.
