I John White of Beaufort County in the province of North Carolina being of perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament.

I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary White after payment of my just debts one third part of my personal estate with the use of the plantation & now live upon also the use of Bauch's Branch or plantation on Jones Creek with the use of my negroes Chloe Sue, George, Paris and Quarto part of my best Mills upon Ellis Creek and on Hollingsworth land during her life to enable her to bring up the children under age.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Jane Kemp twenty shillings proclamation money.

I give and bequeath to my sons James and Griffith White One hundred and fifty acres of land back part of Green Oak, wherein they may a Saw Mill.

I give and bequeath to my sons Griffith and

John White. Three hundred acres of land on the lower side of Jones Creek, together with half the stream running through said land.

I give and bequeath unto my son William White one hundred and fifty acres of land being the lower part of the plantation I now live on and Jones William McRee's land.

I give and bequeath to my son David White one half the quiet and saw Mills upon Ellis Creek and on Hollingsworth land together with half the saw, tools and timber belonging to said Mills.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Storrey the one fifth part of all the negroes except negro that shall be or may be at my decease except so far

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary White eighty pounds proc money one negro girl between fourteen and twenty years of age also a feather bed and bed clothes. Bed, Skillit, Drayton for a young man two heifers and some fowling

I give and bequeath to my son Matthew White one hundred and ninety five acres of lands joining Alexander Hargraves land and known by the name of Little Bonninton. Also two hundred acres of land on the Cottontail side of Jones Creek. One hundred acres is in Bauch's Branch which he is not to have till after his mother's decease the other one hundred acres joining to David White land taken up in the same patent as the three hundred acres. I intend to John Driftick White all my negroes George and Paris, after the decease of his mother. Matthew paying my son David fifty pounds proclamation money it being one half the price of lot. is or letting David have the work of said negroes for and during the term of three years instead of the fifty pounds above mentioned.

I give and bequeath to my son James White the plantation I now live on after his mother dies containing two hundred acres with the house or cabin and furniture therein. Only my above named son James is to pay my daughter Mary White the pounds five on young negro Michel as is herein

mentioned out of the said land or otherwise.

all the moreables except a fifit Part which I will to Ann Harvey to be equally divided between Griffick John, William David Mary and Martha White after the decease of my wife Mary White.

And Lastly I appoint my wife Mary White my Son James White Executors of this my last Will and Testament, revoking and disannulling all former Wills by me made. Declaring this to be my last Will and Testament.

Moreover I before signing that what negroes that shall be after my Wifes death shall be for my Son John and Matthew White and their heirs forever.

I William Singletary of Beaufort County South Carolina being made in body yet of sound and perfect understanding and memory praised by god do make this my last Will and Testament, as follows that my just debts and funeral charges be paid by my Executors here after named.

Item I give to my beloved wife Mary the use of my plantation wherow I now live with negroes Stock and Household stuff wherow she remains a widow until my youngest son,

comes to the age of twenty one years, in case my wife Mary should die before my youngest son comes of age then & once that my Executors shall want the same for the good of my children

I give to my son William Singletary two hundred and fifty acres of land known by the name of Singletarys Buff Eighty acres known by the name of Old Pasture, or Sugar Loaf point to his his or assigns forever.

I give to my son Council Singletary the plantation which I now live on, when he is twenty one years old except my wife should survie him chuse of a son then in that case my plantation shall be equally divided between my son Council and the one not yet born, if a daughter then shall have an equal share of my personal estate with my other children.

I give to my brother Richard Singletary all my Manses Clothes, my Bedst Beddes and Bedf Watch to him his Heirs and assigns forever

I do hereby Constitute make and ordain James Cowell and Richard Lloyd my sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament.

I do hereby disown revoke and disannulle all and every other former Wills Legacies or Executors by me made or appointed.
