I Thomas Onen being of sound mind and memory blessed be God, and knowing the uncertainty of this life do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

I desire that my body be buried at the discretion of my Executors herein after named.

I desire that all my just debts be paid.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Stedman one tract of land containing six hundred and forty acres lying on the North East side of Cape Fear River joining the upper side of Richard Sattens land to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my son James Onen the remainder of my lands on the North East side of Cape Fear River to him and his heirs forever, including the Barren Mill and the adjacent lands belonging.

I give and bequeath unto John Onen all the land on the South West side of the Cape Fear River that he possesses including houses and improvements of any kind whatever, to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my wife Eleanor Onen two hundred acres of land to be purchased by my Executors, to be paid for out of the whole of my estate if she does incline to live with some of my children the land to be here forever.

I desire that the remainder of my estate to be equally divided between my wife Eleanor Onen Mary Stedman James Onen and John Onen, only having respect to the things already given my daughter by me.

I desire that my two sons education may be finished by my Executors. I do hereby appoint James Moorhead and Eliza Stedman to be my Executors in this my last will and testament, revoking all former wills made by me 10th of February, 1799.
