I also give unto my wife for and my Horse six Cows and Calves Fifteen head of Yearling Hogs. Fourteen pigs and ten Cows three head of sheep. All my household and Kitchen Furniture my Plantation Tools. all my Corn and Bacon in hand and in the Bush and in the Field and all the other goods and chattels I own.

for my wife during her widowhood and if she becomes ungovernable I want her to live with out the notes and money I want laid out for my Negroes to the best advantage for my children and let my wife have the use of such negroes until the youngest child is raised. The residue of my stock I wish to be sold at public auction.

I have forty barrels of Tar at Elizabethtown I want it sold to the best advantage at private sale.

I nominate and appoint Elias Monroe and John M. Lenoir Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills or Wills by me made at any time.

This 21st day of January A.D. 1840

My beds and furniture I give to my wife and also the Family Bible three Books in four volumes containing Encyclopaedia I want them sold.

I publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament.

appointed for all men once to die. do this the 24th
day of June in the Year of Our Lord One thousand
Eight hundred and Forty one make and publish
this my last will and Testament in manner and
form following - that is to say principally and first
of all.

I resign my soul into the hands of Almighty God
who gave it and my body to the earth to be
buried in a christian burial at the discretion of
my Executor hereafter named. Hoping through the
merits of my beloved Saviour and redeemed
Jesus Christ. to have a glorious resurrection and
as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it pleased

and dispose of in the manner and form fol-
lowing.

Deceases - It is my Will and desire that all
my just debts be paid including my funeral charges.
I give devise and bequeath unto my Son John
McCall all the lands I may be possessed of
with the exception of two acres of land whereon the
grave yard lies.

Then I give and bequeath unto my son John
McCall the following property namely my first wife
and her Will with all the utensils thereunto belong-
ing and the following named Slaves viz. Jerry
Thomas. Roger Sonny. Peter Dick. Sydney. Eliza Jack.
Sophia. Sela. Sidney. and John. also all my former
utensils, also all my household and kitchen furniture
also all my books of every description also a note
by John. Dnt McMillan payable to me two other
notes one on Duncan Bowie and one on Duncan
Clark. deceased.

Then I give and bequeath to my daughter
Susannah having received her proportion
of the same to said daughter.
