

RECORD OF WILLS.

One hundred and fifty acres of land in Bladen County on the South Side of Cypress Branch and one Bed and Furniture and Twenty shillings Cash.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Luscacia One Cow and Calf. And a Cow and Yearling and a two year old Heifer and a three year old steer and one Bed and Furniture.

I give and bequeath to my true beloved daughter Charity Twenty Shillings Cash.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Rumpsey fifty acres of land in Bladen County, on the South side of Cabbages or Potters Branch in the fork of the Mill Branch, being part of a Survey granted to John Willis and then running nearly a South course so as to include One hundred and fifty acres of the two other surveys. And also Fifty acres lying above on the South side so as to include these hundred acres in the whole and some land of Cattle and one Bed and Furniture.

I give and bequeath to my true beloved daughter Polly two Cows and Yearlings and a two year old Heifer and one Bed and Furniture.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved Son Harry all the lands belonging to me that is not before given including the plantation whereon I now live and five head of cattle to consist of One Cow and Calf and a Cow and Yearling and a Barren Cow, and a year old Heifer and one Bed and Furniture.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved Wife Luscacia my Negro girl named Katie and my white horse bridle & Saddle. and a yoke of Oxen and all my plantation tools and household furniture of every kind whatever that is not before given and all my chattel that is not before given and all my sheep and hogs for the use and support of my wife and my children, now living with my wife and I also land unto my wife before named my negro man named Casperrod during her life time and after her decease I give my Negro man Casperrod to my son Harry.

In Will and desire that my well beloved wife Luscacia

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Luscacia takes charge of the money now in hand and collect the money due to me and purchase a negro girl which after being done I lend the negro girl so to be purchased to my well beloved wife during her life but in case of accident or other mean the money should be so exhausted as not to purchase the negro girl above named timely that then and in that case my son Casperrod to have Fifty Dollars as soon as he is out of his minority and the balance to be at the disposal of my wife and after the decease of my wife an equal division take place among them all my children of the property that my wife may then be enriched. And Lastly I do appoint my well beloved wife Luscacia Executrix and my son John my son Theophilus Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

Plaintiff being in perfect mind and memory and understanding thanks be to god therefore but considerin the uncertainty of human life and knowing it is accolted for all men to die do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following that to say.

As to what world estate it lies pleased god bless me most in this world of give divine and

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2nd "Thur" in the beginning named and form, viz
First of all I give unto my half Brother John Cain
ten Shillings Sterling to him and his friends.

3rd "Thur" I give unto my half Brother James Cain the sum of
ten Shillings Sterling to him and his friends.

4th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto my Nephew Joseph
Cain the son of Samuel Cain the sum of ten Shillings
Sterling.

5th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto George Willis Seny
of Robeson County the sum of ten Shillings Sterling to
him and his heirs forever.

6th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto Ann Robeson the wife
of Jonathan Robeson, and daughter to Samuel and
Susan Cain one hundred and fifty acres of land
where I now live and two hundred acres lying the
upper side and joining the lower side of Thomas
Scribner land, during her natural life at present
the land is to descend to her son Samuel Robeson with
all chattels and houses therein.

I give unto the said Ann Robeson two clocks now
in the house and one desk, all the tables in the house
and tea equipage one feather bed and furniture.

I give unto the said Ann Robeson two negroes, much ad
her child better at the death of said Ann.

I desire that the furniture and negroes with their
increase may be divided among her children.

7th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto Mary Stidham of Fayette
ville one feather bed and furniture.

8th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Lock wife
of Benjamin Lock one feather Bed and Furniture.

9th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto Sarah Herring wife
to Richard Herring all my wife's wearing apparel
including two small Trunks and all that is in them
also one large Chest.

10th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto James and John Cane
two lots in Elizabethtown to them and their heirs
forever.

11th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto James Morehead and
Thomas Cane, five hundred acres of land lying on
the back of the land where I now live to be equally
divided between them and their heirs forever.

12th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto Jean Scribner wife to Thomas
Scribner one feather bed which has Oynaberry ticks
also two cows and calves to her and her heirs forever.

13rd "Thur" I give and bequeath unto Jonathan Robeson three
hundred and thirty acres of land lying on the Great
Branch R. paying some Rent or money due on it the
half of six hundred and forty acres taken up by Thomas
and John Robeson also one Still I give to said Jonathan

14th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto James Walker a free
black boy living with me one hundred acres of land
lying on the back of Thomas Scribner land. I desire
that the said James shall be educated to learn to read
write and cipher the schooling to be paid out of my
estate, as my Executors may find it most convenient. Thus
I desire that he be put in a trade the land to be James
Walters and his friends.

15th "Thur" I give and bequeath unto my Roger Sixty
acres of land lying on the back of Thomas Scribner
land and part of the land not needed to James
Walker and partition by Joshua Henderson and give
him his Cows and calves, also four cows and pigs the
said Roger to be under the direction of my Executors
so long as he lives. He is not a legacy giving any per
son at the death of the said Roger the land and
remaining part of the stock left him is to go to the
Negro James Walker and his heirs forever.

16th "Thur" I desire that my negro man James may be
sold at the direction of my Executors and the money
arising from the sale, may be disposed of towards
paying my expence according to the estate.

17th "Thur" I desire that my old Slave Quash and Hora
may be provided for out of my estate as I do not
mean that they shall be a legacy to any person.

18th "Thur" I desire that my part of my Estate and every part that
I have not minded or given as legacies may be sold
and the monies arising from the sales may be
appropriated to such use as the Executors may see
proper for.
