I give to Thomas Lamb one Shilling Sterling
I give to Absalom Lamb one Shilling Sterling
I give to Rachel Davis one Shilling Sterling
I give to Patience Carter one Shilling Sterling
Lastly I do appoint Jacob and Isaac Lamb
my sole Executors after my decease,

I Henry Glass of the state of North Carolina and County of Beaufort. Planted being in perfect health of body and of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto Almighty God calling unto mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die so make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all. I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God. That gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors. Not by stoneling but at the general resurrection I shall

receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith I East pleased. God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Mary Glass. all and singular the messuage tenement where I now live containing 300 acres. and to remain without interruption during her widowhood and no longer.

I give to my son Solomon Glass. one shilling Sterling to be paid him out of my Estate and no more.

I give to my son Littleton Glass. my Plantation called Number Bridge and there other Farms Antiquous to the same my negro boy Ned. to him his heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my daughter Mary Glass my negro Much Danus and all my stock of sheep on Drunken Creek in the County of Craven State.

I give to my son Levy Glass. 150 acres of land on Drayton branch and 150. on Juniper Swamp. My still. Five Cows and Calves and Six Ewes. to him his heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my son Thomas Glass my dwelling house and plantation where I now live containing 300 acres of land after reserving as above mentioned reserved for my wife share to him his heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my daughter Anna Glass. fifteen Cows and Calves and Ten Ewes. to her heirs and assigns forever.

I give to my daughter Betsy Glass. my much Rose to her and her heirs. and assigns forever.

I also order that all and singular the remaining part of my estate be equally divided between my children. Littleton, Mary, Thomas, Levy, Rita and Betsy.

I likewise institute and ordain my wife Mary Glass and David Singletary white Executors and Executors of this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby utterly disown and revoke and disannul all and every other Testament Wills Legacies Executors and bequeathers by one in any wise before made

or bequeathed ratifying this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 24th day of January 1779. and in the
second year of American Independence
Signed sealed published pronounced
and declared by the said George Stiles
as his last Will and Testament
in the presence of each other
Also heretofore subscribed our names.

sound and perfect memory chuse to leave unto
God for it but leaving it nevertheless the sum of
fifty pounds to my wife and the sum of
fifty pounds to my son George Reed.
I give and bequeath my eldest son
George Reed 300 acres of land lying on a branch
of Durgin's Little Marsh including plantations
whereon William Godfrey now lies with his wife
and children to be divided out of the choice of the
stock in the place to be kept with their names
on the same till he comes of age to him and
his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Philip Reed
one hundred acres of land South Side of the
Big Marsh, being the land I bought of Isaac Knobell
with one hundred acres joining it to be taken up
if the affords is opened in good terms with five
cows and calves as good as any in the stock.

his master to have the privilege of living on the
plantation till he comes of age if she chooses to him
and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Solomon Reed
One hundred acres of land on Hog pen branch being
a branch off Rock fish and the same give one by my
ninth child Phillip Reed. with fifteen pounds brook and
and five good cows and calves to him and his
heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my true beloved wife Dorothy
Reed. 10 acres and calves with all the house
hold furnished with the work of my negro York
as long as she lives a widow to raise the children
and in case she marries fec to have her third of
the legacy and the other two thirds to be equally divided
between my three children
Also girl to my wife the Bay mare and all the hogs
for the use of the family. The remaining part of my
stock that is not mentioned in any part of my estate
to be sold to pay my debts and funeral charges
and to pay the fifteen pounds mentioned to be
given to my son Solomon. The remaining part of
which with forty pounds brook to be equally divided
between my wife and my three sons.
And Lastly I nominate and appoint my true beloved
wife Dorothy Reed and Henry Nesson, my whole &
sole Executor and Executor to this my last Will and
Testament. Given under my hand and seal this the 10th
day of May. anno Domini 1779.

The word Joining in the second legacy and the word a widow
in the 4th legacy intended before signed also the word
part of my estate brought.
