I William Moore of Bladen County and Province of North Carolina, being weak of body but of perfect memory, Prayed he God to make this my last Will and Testament as follows Imperious - I give to my son James Moore this plantation wherein I now live the paying the sum of One Hundred and fifty pounds. that is to say my lawful debt and the remainder equally divided between my wife and two daughters.

I leave to my son William Moore the plantation wherein my father in law now dwells when he comes of age.

As for my moveable estate I leave that to the discretion of my wife to be divided between her and my two daughters.

I do hereby nominate and appoint my Brother John Moore and Peter Byrnes, Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th day of November in the Year of our Lord 1767.

The 14th day of May 1778. I Mary Mayfield "Widow" of Bladen County North Carolina being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory Prayed he give unto God thanks for having unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all

I give and recommend my soul unto the Hands of God that gave it. and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors quickening death but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate as I have it hath pleased almighty God to bless me in this World. I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

Imperious - It is my Will and I do order that in the first place all my debt and funeral charges be paid and satisfied.

I then

I give and bequeath unto my Will beloved daughter Anne Foxworth all my wearing clothes at the discretion of my Executors.

I then

I give to my Will beloved son Robert Conkey whom I likewise constitute make and ordain my Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament all and singular my estate Real and personal by him self to be possessed and enjoyed and I do hereby utterly disallow and revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments Wills Legacies bequests and Executors by me in any ways before made made and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.
