## RECORD OF WILLS.

In the Name of God "Amen"

I Matthew Byrne of Bladon County in the State of North Carolina being in good Health and of perfect Mind and Memory do make ordain and constitute this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath to my son James A. Byrne the following negroes Joe Jack, Kinner and their increase that have been born since they were in possession, or any increase they may hereafter have. The said negroes the said James A. Byrne has received and valued at the sum of One Thousand Dollars when given

2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Andres, now deceased, and her children and their heirs for ever the following negro which was in her and Sam Andres possession at the time of her my daughter Sarah Andres deceased, namely Duke and Lucy, and their increase including the children that have been born, and may hereafter be born to the said negroes. The said Sarah Andres received and valued when given at the sum of One Thousand Dollars.

3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my son J. Byrne the following negroes. Namely - Peter, Simon and Phoebe and their increase that may have the said negroes. The said Old J. Byrne has received and valued at the time given at one thousand dollars.

4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Sophia Carver during her natural life and then to her children the following negroes. Namely Mary and her children, Caroline, Elias, and Sophia and also Sately and her child, and their increase including also the children that have been born since in their possession or any increase they may have after now. The said negroes the said Sophia Carver has received and valued when given at the sum of Fifteen Hundred dollars.

5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my son Richard Carver as he has not had any negroes I give him Five Dollars besides his

ratio or part of the rest of the negroes with the children.

6<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my son Thomas M. Byrne the restable part of the negroes with the rest of my children taking out of his part named Jacob. Also the gold to Samuel Andres. for four hundred dollars

7<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Maria Robison the following negroes that is Maria and her and their increase that they may have born the said negroes. The said Anna Maria Robison has received and valued when given at the sum of three hundred dollars.

I will and desire that my other children my son John M. Byrne and my daughter Moley M. Byrne and my Son Matthew Byrne with Richard and Thomas Byrne we have an equal share of what negroes may be in the plantation or belonging to me at my decease

I also will and desire that what land I may be possessed of may be divided among my son James Alex. Richard, Thomas, John, and Matthew Byrne. Also has had two hundred acres of this part of my land, already giving my daughters a small portion of this part. say Fifty Dollars each.

I bequeath to my wife Mary Byrne a choice part of the perishable property of my estate and her life time in the lands.

And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my Sons James, Alex, Richard and Thomas Byrne Executors of this my last Will and testament whereof I have set my hand this 15<sup>th</sup> day of December 1837

I wish and direct that after the children is made equal out of the perishable property that I may have the balance to be divided equally. The older ones making up for keeping stock to that they have had

Since I wrote this will I have given my son Richard L. Byrne the following negroes widow and her children Alfred Sandy and Eliza and the income that they may have from the time of the said negroes that said Richard Byrne has received valued when given at One Thousand Dollars and Richard paid me One hundred and forty five dollars to be taken out of their valuation makes their value Nine hundred and forty five dollars.

of the County and state aforesaid being in good health and sound mind and reasoning but knowing the uncertainty of life do in the name of Almighty God make and ordain this to be my last will and testament at the same time utterly revoking all wills heretofore made by me - viz.

1st I give to my sister husband and daughter Will Beard and Sophia Scowring one dollar each.

2nd I give to my brother Skinkin M. Plumber one dollar.

3rd I give and bequeath to my dear wife Lucy all my lands my Negroes that I now possess as also the Negroes and land given to me by my Father at the death of my brother with all that was left me in my estate of cattle and horses

My horses and farming utensils and long the I possess unless she should within the space of eight months after my death be delivered a child and said child live to be grown or one and it is my will and desire that it should have one half of the Negroes also at the death of my dear wife the lands wherein I live the house to remain my dear wife and her heirs forever.

Should the child die before my wife it is my will and desire the property continue my wife and her heirs forever.

In testimony of which I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this 11<sup>th</sup> of May in the year of our Lord eighteen thirty eight

I further will and bequeath unto my brother in law Joseph Thames the land given me by my father in his last will and testament lying on the east side of Cape Fear river (it being the place where my father last resided after the death of my mother) she having a life estate in the same.

I further hereby ordain and appoint my much esteemed friends Jonathan Cowan John Smith as Executors of this my last will and testament.
