Also one half of my stock of Cattle in Georgia now in the possession of John Branchaw deducting five likely young Cows, and calves out of said stock.

I also give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Sarah Chisty Bonds Cash.

I also do give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Susannah, Thirty Bonds Cash.

I do give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Squations one Negro Boy named Ben. and three hundred acres of land situate in the office in my name. Joining Bonnis. Stephen Cordis and Costa King. Stevens. live - also two hundred and twenty acres of land east of Brumding Creek, including a Bluff part purchased of Abner. Griffin and the other of Alexander. Gordonis.

I do also give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Richard Flowers. one Negro girl named Mary also the plantation whereon I now live containing four hundred acres of land also fifty acres of land joining Joseph. Abblee. live on Long Branch. and it is my will that the said Mary named Chid. and one Negro girl named Phillis. and fifty head of Hogs. and thirty head of Cattle and ten head of Sheep and three head of Horses. be sold and the money equally divided among my beloved daughters Emma Chauncy and Milly. and Alice. and it is my will that what household furniture and farming utensils remain after my decease be equally divided between the foregoing Children viz:

Squations. Richard. Emma Chauncy Milly. and Alice

I do give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Morgan the remaining half of my stock. of Cattle in Georgia in the possession of John Branchaw. excepting the five Cows and calves before deducted. and it is my will that the estate remain in the hands of the Executors until my beloved Son. Richard comes out of his minority. and I do appoint some Writch Flowers and Operations Flowers. Executors to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 25th day of October 1793.

I Chauncy Lloyd widow of the late David Lloyd formerly of Bladen County of the State of North Carolina now deceased considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God for the same. do make and publish this my last will and testament as manner and form as following.

I do give and bequeath the whole and later of my Negro Slave Stan and select. and Priscilla and the use and occupation of all my other property unto my Son in Law Richards Corrie in trust for the said Stan after expenses and for the expense he will incur in raising and giving good education to my two grand children William and Elizabeth Ann Lloyd. the children of the said Richards wife by former marriage

I do give and bequeath from and after the said William. Williams comes to the age of twenty one years a Contract matrimony the one half of the said slave that is the whole and labor of the said slave. and increase and the use and occupation of the one half of the other part of my property. and the increase to the said William Williams for life. but if he Contracts matrimony it shall be to him and his heirs forever.

I do give and bequeath from and after the said Elizabeth Ann Lloyd. shall come to the age of Eighteen years. or Contracts matrimony the whole and labor of the other half of said slave and increase and the use and the occupation of the other half of my property unto the said Elizabeth Ann Lloyd for life. but if she Contracts matrimony it shall be to her and her heirs forever.

In case of the death of either the said William Williams or Elizabeth Ann Lloyd without lawful issue I do give and bequeath to the Survivor the whole and labor of the slaves and the use and occupation of the property which deceased was entitled to. or should have been entitled to. claim under this my will.

In case of the death of both William Williams and of the said Elizabeth Ann Lloyd without lawful issue or Contracting matrimony. I do give and bequeath the whole right of Property in my child

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bequeathed limited or mentioned unto my daughter
 Nancy Garrison wife of the aforesaid Richard Garrison
 and her heirs forever.

And I do appoint my Son in Law Richard Garrison
 and my truly friend Patrick Kelly, Executors to
 this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking
 all former and other Wills by me made.

 preference. Also such Legacies above mentioned.

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being sick I will ordain and appoint William Watts
 James the Executor of this my last Will and Testament
 February 21st 1804
