Ch. paper writing without Subscribing witnesses, purporting to be the last Will and Testament of James Robison deceased is exhibited for probate in Open Court, by Thomas D. McDonald, one of the Executors therein named, and it is therupon proved by the oath and examination of Chas. Compton and Cudlitt witnesses to wit: Darren Sims Benjamin, F. Randolph, and Colin Monroe, that they are acquainted with the said writing of the said James Robison having often seen him write and know him that the name of the said James Robison subscribed to the said will, and the said will itself and every part thereof are in the said writing of the said James Robison, and it is further proved by the evidence of the above witnesses that the said writing is generally known to the acquaintances of the said James Robison.

It is therefore considered by the Court that the said paper writing is the last Will and Testament of the said James Robison. And the same is ordered to be recorded and filed.

And therupon Thomas D. McDonald, one of the Executors therein named, duly qualified as such by taking the oath required by Law, and enters into bond in the sum of Five hundred thousand dollars with Colie Monroe and John D. McDonald as securities therefor.

I, Clark Kelly of the County of Bladen and state of Clark Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit:

That my Executor herein after named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relation and friends and pay all funeral expenses. Together with my just debts reasonable and to whomsoever owing out of the monies that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

I give and bequeath unto my son William C. Kelly his heirs and assigns forever one Bedstead Bed and Furniture and my Gold Watch and Travelling Trunk but should he die then I want them to go to my son John C. Kelly his heirs and assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to my son John C. Kelly his heirs and assigns forever.

I give and bequeath unto my son John C. Kelly his heirs and assigns forever one Bed Bedstead and Furniture and my Shot Gun,

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucy Jane two hundred and Sixty acres of land including my Mansion House, all out houses, and other improvements to have and to hold to her the said Lucy Jane for and during the term of her natural life in satisfaction for and in lieu of her donee, in all my Real Estate, the said land is known as the old hundred acre tract and as the though don hundred acres tract, and forty acres adjoining and thirty acres adjoining Dr. McKinnon

I give and bequeath unto all my children all my books to be equally divided between them shall and shall alike.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lucy Jane during her natural life my negroes, Gibbs, Dick and Molly, my Household and Kitchen furniture together with the Farming utensils and my carriage and horses a Yoke of Oxen and Cart and my gray horse Saddle & bridle, Twenty Head of sheep and two milk cows and Calves, my wife Charles in my stable & Cows

red Stein and all the provisions in hand and all my stock of hogs and of the growing crop. One hundred bushels of Potatoes. One hundred bushels of Corn and two thousand pounds of Potash. and the stocks and twenty bushels of rice. the pea crop and the crop of sugar cane

It is my will and desire that after the death of my beloved wife Lucy Jane that the lands the negroes and their issue and increase. Household and Kitchen furniture and stock of all kind herein before bequeathed and devised to my beloved wife during her natural life be equally divided between all my children this sum and assigns forever. Share and share alike

I give and devise to all my children their heirs and assigns forever, the residue of my lands to be equally divided between them share and share alike.

It is my will and desire that all the residue of my estate, after taking out the devises and legacies above mentioned shall be sold and the debts owing to me paid and if there should be any surplus over and above the payment of my debts and expenses that most surplus shall be equally divided and paid over to all my children in equal proportions share and share alike to them and to each and every of them their Executors administrators and assigns absolutely forever.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my trustee friend N. S. Kemp my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof. Relying respecting and declaring utterly void all other Wills and Testaments by me before made.

In witness whereof I the said Steve Kelly do subscribe and sign and seal this 12th day of August 1864

And therefore N. S. Kemp the Executor therein named doth qualify as such by taking the oath required by Law, and enters into bond in the sum of fifty thousand dollars, with J. A. McDonald as security thereto which bond is accepted by the Court and ordered to be filed.
