 is not enough to discharge them the plantation where
 I now live to be sold. and when my debts are paid
 the remainder for my beloved wife to subsist upon
 I do leave and authorize for my Executors my
 Sons William James Mier and William

Byran and Elizabeth Coleman my burying to be decent
 at the discretion of Executors.
