the lower half of the above mentioned three hundred
and twenty acres with all buildings and improve-
ments thereto to him his heirs and assigns from

Item After the decease of my loving wife Caroline Singletary
I give and bequeath unto my four daughters
Elizabeth, Deborah and Mary all my household goods
as also my stock of cattle horses and hogs to
be equally divided between them immediately after
their mothers decease at the discretion of my Exec-
utors, and I do hereby utterly disclaim revoke
and disannul all other former wills by
me made.

I do declare this and no other to be my
last Will and Testament. And I hereby
nominate ordain and appoint my loving
brothers Benjamin Randolph and James
Orvis to be my lawful Executors of this my

Sub^r of the County of Bladen and Province of North
Carolina being sickly and weakly in body but of
perfect mind and memory thankes be unto God
therefor calling unto mind the mortallity of my
body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die do make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament, that is to say principally and
first of all I give and recommend my soul into
the hands of God that gave it and my body I
recommend to be buried in a decent Christian burial
at the discretion of my Executors, not doubting but
at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the power of God, and as touching such
worldly estate wherewith it has pleased god to
bless me in this life I give devise and dispose
of the same in the following manner and form

Impression I give and bequeath to my Will
beloved son Benjamin Singletary the sum
of his body fourt. three hundred and twenty
acres of land beginning at the long corner
of the same. Camps or the Stray boge land

in Punkt Branch likewise I give to my son Benjamin

I give to my well beloved son William Singletary
and to the heirs of his body forever the plantation
whereon I now live beginning at the Slave Landing
Thence down the N.W. River containing three
hundred and twenty acres be it more or less

Also I give my son William four hundred and
forty acres joining the same part of my back tract
on Harrison's Creek, also my negro fellow called
young Pompey.

I give and bequeath to my son Richard Singletary
five hundred acres of land known by the name of
Susan Camps or Stratobys to him and the heirs
of his body forever

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Singletary widow
of John Singletary my negro fellow named Charles

I give to my son in law Elkanah Allen six
shillings proclamation money.

I give to my well beloved wife Joyce Singletary
my negroes Tom, Jimmy, and Judy during her
life than I give Tom to my son Richard, Jimmy to
and Judy to be divided between my sons William
and Richard.

I likewise give unto my wife Joyce my household
furniture and stuff during her life the to be divided
between my sons Benjamin, William and Richard

I do constitute make and ordain my son
William Singletary and my nephew William Sutor
my sole executors of this my last will and testament

And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and
disannull all and every other former testament
will, legacies, rights and executors by me in any
ways before named willed and bequeathed
ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last will and testament

I Richard Singletary of the County of Bladen and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following observing whatsoever such bequests, devises and distributions as shall appear to be made in this my last Will and Testament.

1st I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah Singletary Fifty acres of land including my dwelling and out houses, and as much cleared land and so may be sufficient for her subsistence also my Negro Man Mingo my bay Mare and one foal and gear one lot one Hoe, two beds and furniture with bed steds all my Kitchen furniture from Ovens and Coopers. Half of my Stock of Hogs and Sheep, Half of my Bee Hives during her natural life.

2nd I give and bequeath to my son Peter Singletary that part of my several land be it more or less which I shall have marked off with stakes direct towards my dwelling house and also at the death of my beloved wife Sarah that part of land above described given to her during our natural life. also the two beds and furniture above named. also one horse named Roebuck, also I desire that my Stock of cattle Hogs sheep and Bees be equally divided between sons Peter and John and daughters Sidney and Sophia Nepony and Amelia.

3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna one Bed and Furniture also one hundred and fifty acres of land called Byrnes Marsh.

4th I give and bequeath to my son John Singletary that part of my several land which I shall mark of by stakes on the lower part of my plantation with an equal part with my son Peter, of all my unclaimed lands to be divided between them share and share alike also one young filly mare, also one feather bed and Furniture already delivered to him, now

5th I give and bequeath to my grand sons Wade Haughton Cain, Samuel Cain, and Richard Cain two hundred acres of land in the storet West River where Joseph Cain now lives and a negro man named Bill, formerly owned by and now in the possession of Joseph Cain to be equally divided between them provided they never claim or call for anything of my Hives in consideration of a negro man named Danbo deeded by me to them with Bill which I have been obliged twice to sell to pay their father debts, and provided they shall ever claim any consideration from my Hives of the above said negro Danbo that then it is my desire that the above two hundred acres of land and negro Bill be equally divided between all my Hives share and share alike.

6th I ordain and appoint my son Peter Singletary Executive to this my last Will and Testament vesting him with full authority to sell any part of my property for the payment of my debts and collect money due me.
