

RECORD OF WILLS.

In the name of God. "Amen"
I, Robert Harvey Planter of the State of North Carolina, and County of Bladen being of sound and disposing mind do make and publish this as my last Will and Testament.

First I desire that after my funeral expenses that all my just debts shall be paid -

I give unto my beloved wife Anna Jane one hundred acres of land, joining the upper side of my green oak plantation also my negro man Jim and my negro woman Chaney - my beds and furniture. The Household and Kitchen Furniture of the place where I reside during her natural life and at her death I give slaves Jim and Chaney to my daughter Harriet Overell. And the lands which to her as above, during life to be equally divided between all my children -

I give to my son William White Harvey my Green Oak plantation say two hundred acres more or less, and two hundred and forty acres of land being a part of a five hundred acre tract patented by James White in the year 1766.

Whine and his heirs forever, also a Negro boy named Watty, and a negro man named Sam and an old woman named Betty, one Bedstead one Bed and Furniture. Whine and his heirs.

I give to my daughter Margaret my negro boy Jack also one Bed and Furniture.

I give to my daughter Eliza Ann, my negro boy, Ezekiel also one Bed and Furniture.

It is my wish that long Betty, should be valued and equally divided between my daughters, Margaret, and Eliza - the one who retains her to pay to the other one half of her value.

I give to my daughter Harriet Overell one Bed and Furniture.

The residue of my Real Estate I wish divided equally between my sons, Alexander R Harvey and John James Harvey and my daughters Eliza Ann and Harriet Overell.

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That part which falls to the share of my two sons be named, as they reside out of the state I give to them and their heirs forever.

It is my wish that the beds and furniture not given. The stock of every kind the farming utensils Household and Kitchen Furniture at the upper place be sold only reserving what may be necessary to support the Widow and all my children in this state for one year, and out of the proceeds to be given to my sons Alex. L. Harvey and John. F. Harvey three hundred dollars each, and if this does not prove sufficient, any deficiency is to be made up from the shares of my four other children.

If any of my said daughters should die leaving no issue it is my wish that such part of my estate either real or personal, as they may be entitled to should go to the rest of the surviving daughters.

I do constitute and appoint my friend Benjamin Fitzgerald, and William White Harvey, Executors to the my last Will and Testament.
