

## RECORD OF WILLS.

In the Name of God. "Amen"

I Robert Melvin Sen<sup>r</sup> of the County of Bladon,  
and State of North Carolina being of sound  
and perfect mind and memory. Blessed be god  
do thi the 15<sup>th</sup> day of October in the Year  
of Our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and  
forty four. make and publish this my last Will  
and Testament, in manner and form following  
that is to say -

And first I direct that my body be decently  
interred in the burying ground at my farm  
and as to such worldly estate as it hath pleased  
god to entrust me with,

I dispose of the same as follows:

First. I direct that all my debts and funeral ex-  
pense be paid as soon after my decease as  
possible out of the first money that shall come  
into the hands of my Executors. from any portion  
of my Estate.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved  
wife Elizabeth Melvin. tracts of land including  
and adjoining the plantation where I now live  
Viz - one tract of land containing one hundred  
and twenty two acres on the south side of  
Big Turnbull. granted to me the 21<sup>st</sup> October 1813  
Also one other tract for one hundred acres granted  
to me the 21<sup>st</sup> December 1814. One other tract  
for fifty acres granted to Daniel Kelsee the  
15<sup>th</sup> of May 1804. Another for one hundred acres  
granted to me the 29<sup>th</sup> of October 1817. another  
tract on Turnbull containing one hundred acres  
granted to Daniel Kelsee the 16<sup>th</sup> of May 1811.  
Another on the east side of Turnbull for 300  
acres granted to John Parker the 9<sup>th</sup> of November  
1819. Another on the south side of Turnbull  
fifty acres granted to me the 25<sup>th</sup> of September  
1816. Another on the east side of Turnbull for  
one hundred acres granted to Joseph Carter the  
11<sup>th</sup> October 1784. Another containing one  
hundred acres a part of a 640 acre survey granted  
to me by my wife Elizabeth Melvin the 11<sup>th</sup>

of August 1802. another east of Turnbull granted to  
David Melvin Sen<sup>r</sup> on the 15<sup>th</sup> of December 1809. also  
one hundred acres more wherein my mill stands also one  
black man Jerry and my black woman Mary. my  
black mare and colt. two cows and calves. Two dogs  
and pigs. thirty two year old hogs and fifteen year old  
hogs. one thousand pounds of Pork. The rest of sheep  
three beds and furniture. my Church Bible and some  
choice hymn book. Household and kitchen furniture  
one iron rake and grass scythe. my crop of corn  
soybeans. Peas. Potatoes. Cotton. Two Hens and gear to be  
hens during her natural life. also.

Then the above negroes. Jerry and Mary to be equally  
divided between my beloved sons. John S. Melvin and  
Joseph M. Melvin. and the lands and perishable  
property. that I have given to my wife at the ex-  
piration of the natural life of my wife Elizabeth  
Melvin. either by death or marriage to be equally  
divided between my beloved sons. George S. Melvin  
John S. Melvin and Joseph M. Melvin.

Secondly. I give and bequeath unto my  
beloved son James S. Melvin. One hundred acres  
of land bought of James McLain. also I give the  
land James all that part of a two hundred acre  
tract. bought of John Melvin Sen<sup>r</sup> that lies on the  
south side of the Big Branch. that lies between  
the said James S. Melvin and what is called the  
John place.

Also I give and bequeath unto my beloved son James  
S. Melvin my black man Penny and Bay horse  
Cows and calves. Two dogs and pigs. Two hens and  
lambs. One bed and furniture. One shot gun that I  
have before given him verbally.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my  
beloved son David R. Melvin. the following  
of land Viz =  
one hundred acres granted to Caleb Weatherhead  
2<sup>nd</sup> of March 1775. another piece for 50 acres  
granted to Ezekiel Dugg<sup>g</sup>. also 100 acres  
to Peter McLain the 19<sup>th</sup> of December  
1775.

granted to Peter Heathcote. granted to Ezekiel Suggo also all that part of the Creek and Lemon land lying on the South West side of a Branch, by the James West Side, and the middle of the Branch for the dividing line also my black boy Onu. Two Cows and Calves two Eens and lambs. Two Sons and pigs. Two two year old hogs. and my Bay Mare and an old shot gun that I have heretofore given him Verbaely.

Fourthly. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Daniel Marshall Melvin. all my lands bought of William J. Jessup. My Negro man Isaac. Two Cows and Calves. Two Sons and pigs. Two Cows and lambs. and my Bay Horse which I have heretofore given him Verbaely. and further I give him my Son Daniel Marshall Melvin Two two year old hogs. and my new single barrel shot gun one Bed and Furniture.

Fifthly - I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter, Eliza Ann Melvin and the heirs of her body. My Negro Woman. named Rachel. and her future offspring. also Two hundred acres of land lying on the "Gum flats" granted to myself. also One hundred and fifty acres granted to James Morgan. and bought of him attorney for Lewis Suggo. Two Cows and Calves. Two Sons and pigs. Two Cows and lambs. also Two two year old hogs and one Bed and Furniture Sixthly. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son William Melvin. the following tract of land. Viz.

One tract of fifty acres granted to myself the 15<sup>th</sup> of June 1818. and another tract of eighty two acres. granted to myself the 11<sup>th</sup> of December 1829. also one hundred and fifty acres granted to Richard Fort. the 29<sup>th</sup> of March 1809. also one hundred acres granted Elias M' Lure. the 23<sup>rd</sup> of October 1805. also all that part of a two hundred acre tract bought of John Watson. Esq<sup>r</sup>. lying to West of the Big

line between him and James H. Melvin. also one hundred and fifty acres in chn fifty acre tracts granted to myself also my negro man Samuel. Two Cows and Calves. Two Sons and pigs. Two Eens and lambs and one Bed and Furniture.

Seventhly = I give and bequeath to my beloved son Arthur H. Melvin. the following tracts of land viz. One hundred and fifty acres granted to Daniel Melvin. the 15<sup>th</sup> of December 1807. also one hundred acres. granted to Peter McLean joining the above one hundred and fifty acres including where Ezekiel Suggo formerly lived and fifty acres granted to myself joining the above and runs across the Big branch. also one hundred acres called the Red Still place. also Six hundred and forty acres on Suggo Mill Pond bought of Samuel Robinson and wife. also my Negro man named Peter. Two Cows and Calves. Two Sons and pigs. Two Cows and lambs and one Bed and Furniture.

Eighthly = I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Robert J. Melvin. the following tracts of land Viz.

One hundred and thirty two and a half acres of land bought of Deacon Cain. Four hundred and fifty acres on and in Suggo Mill Pond. granted to myself. One hundred acres including the McLean plantation. Granted to Peter McLean. the 25<sup>th</sup> of October 1805. also one hundred acres granted to myself the 13<sup>th</sup> of June 1818. also one hundred acres more granted to myself the 13<sup>th</sup> of June 1818. one hundred acres. Granted to Peter McLean the 25<sup>th</sup> of December 1801. also all that part of a one hundred and fifty acre tract. lying on the South West side of Coves branch. granted to Peter McLean the 1<sup>st</sup> of November 1815; and a balance of this tract I give and bequeath unto my son William Melvin. Also I give and bequeath unto my beloved son H. Melvin. my Negro and

Two Pows and lambs, one bed and furniture.  
Ninety I give and bequeath unto my  
grand children Robert M. Elizabeth and  
Elmas. Less up Fifty acres of land bought of  
Horn et al. and Fifty acres joining the  
above granted to myself also One hundred and  
fifty acres in the Guin Blak' granted to Shadr.  
Heathersby also one gray Pow and a Bed and  
furniture which I gave them before her  
death.

Further I give and bequeath unto my three  
sons George, J. John Sands and Joseph M. Melvin  
all the balance of my lands which I have not  
heretofore given away to be equally divided be  
tween them.

And I further give or leave to my beloved wife  
Elizabeth Melvin, for the purpose of raising and  
educating my children who may be under  
the age of twenty one at my death my  
negro man Abram and my negro Woman Dauney  
together with her children Rose Dauney and  
Sally to be hers during her natural life, and then  
to be equally divided between my three sons  
George, J. John S. and Joseph M. Melvin to  
gether with any future increase there may be  
of the above named negro Woman Dauney and her  
children.

I further give and bequeath unto my son  
David B. Melvin, all that part of a tract of  
land bought of John Melvin Esq<sup>r</sup> lying  
South East of the Lightwood Log Branch, & the  
main road.

I further direct that my Executors hereinafter  
to be named sell on a credit of \$4  
million all the property which I have not left  
before giving away and the proceeds arising  
therefrom to be applied to the payment of my  
bank debts if any left to be given to my beloved  
Elizabeth Melvin and I do now hereby ap-  
point as my Executors James H. and David B.  
Melvin.
