and ordain this my last Will and Testament that

and recommend my soul unto the hands of almighty
God that gave it and my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my Executors
nothing doubting but at the General Resurrec-
tion I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of God and as touching such worldly estate
as it has pleased God to bless me with in
this life I give devise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form "And"

First I give and bequeath to my Mother Caroline M. Master
all my estate Real and Personal lands and tenements
during her life then to be equally divided between
my wife and child, all but the land and that I
give to my child when she comes of age, that is
to say my lawful begotten daughter Catharine.

And I do hereby utterly disavow revoke disannul
all and every other Wills Testaments and Legacies
bequests and Executors by me in any ways before
named bequeathed or made, ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
And I do appoint John Thomas Junr. Francis Davis
and James Brading my Executors of this my
last Will and Testament.

wife Ruth M. Conkey my plantation whereon I
now live during her natural life and at
her death it is my Will and desire that my
land be sold by my Executors and the money
arising from such sale to be equally divided

between my Cousin Ann Corington, John Fowler and William Fowler as they may arrive to the age of Maturity to receive share and share alike.

I give and bequeath to my niece Lydia Freeman the one half of my stock of Meat Cattle together with one half of my stock of hogs to be delivered her as early as there can be a division made after my decease.

I give and bequeath to my Cousin Ann Corington my young sorrel horse

I lastly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ruth McConley all the remaining part of my personal estate which I am possessed of & which is not before bequeathed to her & her heirs forever.

I do constitute make and ordain my loving wife Ruth McConley executrix & Thomas Cook and James Morehead Executors of this my last will and Testament. I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all & every other former testament, Wills & Legacies & bequeaths & in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & signed my name in my own way before named Wills & bequeathed ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament.

Therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will and testament.

That is to say principally and first of all I give & recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my executors & nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God & as touching such worldly estate as I have it hath pleased God to bless me in this life. I give devise & dispose of the same in manner & form following.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Jesse Mustle White one shilling sterling.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Thomas Mustle White one shilling sterling.

I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Amy, one shilling sterling.

I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Elizabeth one shilling sterling.

I give & bequeath unto my ^{loving} wife Mary Mustle White all the remainder of my estate both Real and personal during her widowhood & in case she marries a child's part.

My will and desire is that my seven daughters Nancy, Ellen, Bridget, Mary, Amelia, Patience and Sarah had an equal part of all my movable estate except my Negroes to them their heirs & assigns forever.

I give and bequeath unto my four sons William, Nathan, Thomas, Alex and Mustle White all my lands and negroes to be equally divided
