this and no other to be my last will and Testament
and I do appoint John Deacon junior, Francis Davis
and James Steuding my Executors of this my
last will and Testament.

Item I give and bequeath to my niece Lydia
Freeman the one half of my stock of meat
cattle together with one half of my stock of hogs
to be delivered her as early as there can be a
division made after my decease.

Item I give and bequeath to my Cousin Ann
Covington my young sorrel horse

Lastly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Ruth McConley all the remaining part of my personal
estate which I am possessed of & which is not
before bequeathed to her & her heirs forever.

I do constitute make and ordain my beloved
wife Ruth McConley executrix of this my last
will and Testament & I do hereby utterly disallow
revoke and disannul all & every other former
testaments, Wills & Legacies & bequests whatsoever
by me in any way before named made or
bequeathed differing & conferring this & no
other to be my last will & testament.

My will and desire is that my seven daughters
Hannah, Eliza, Bridget, Mary, Amelia, Patience
and Sarah have an equal part of all my
moveable estate except my Negroes to them alone.
have & assigns forever.

I give and bequeath unto my four sons
Miltaz, Nathan, Thomas, Elia and Mustle White
all my lands and negroes to be equally di-
